Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Date: October 8, 2025, 9:30a.m. - 11:00a.m.

Location: Remote – Online Meeting Only (Zoom Meeting)

Welcome and Introductions

Doug Cox, PSRC, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

Action: Approval of Meeting Summary

The August 13, 2025 meeting summary was approved as presented.

Discussion: Transportation Policy Board Debrief and RTP Development

Craig Helmann, PSRC, shared an update regarding the RTP scenario analysis results, development schedule, and feedback from the Board. The gap between available revenues and proposed expenditures is 21% for the 2026 RTP. Four scenarios with various levels of investments focusing on a variety of investment types have been analyzed and discussed to determine the best benefit for the Region moving forward. Explanations of the four scenarios and analysis metrics included in the linked presentation below. The Board will take action on the investment and funding portfolio in October and continue financial strategy discussions as necessary. PSRC has a total of six regional public meetings to inform the public about the RTP development. Both the Boards and the public seem to prefer scenarios 2A and 2B. PSRC will release the draft RTP for public comment in December.

Likely additional revenue sources that PSRC has identified include, road usage surcharges, license and registration fees, county road levy, sales tax allocated to local transit projects, and retail delivery fees.

Discussion: Other Business and Announcements

WSDOT is awaiting federal obligation for the INFRA award for truck parking facilities at this time. FMCSA portion of the grant is being implemented, ending at the end of October. WSDOT will be sharing an update on their new Freight Plan development at the November 4th WSDOT MPO/ RTPO meeting.

FMSIB will release their Freight Mobility Strategic Investment Program call for projects December. The call will close in early March. This is a six-year investment updated each biennium. FMSIB will host webinars to answer questions about the Call in November and February. FMSIB expects to have an updated list of projects in June or July with a formal submission of projects to the legislature in December 2026.
