Subject: Draft Regional Transportation Plan Release and Public Comment

#### IN BRIEF

Throughout 2025, the Transportation Policy Board has worked on a new Regional Transportation Plan. This included identifying priority policy areas, reviewing plan elements, evaluating plan scenarios, and providing direction on the financial strategy.

At their December 11 meeting, the Transportation Policy Board will be asked to direct staff to develop and release a draft of the Regional Transportation Plan for public review and comment. At the December RSC meeting, staff will provide an overview of the draft plan and provide a demonstration of the draft RTP Engagement Hub.

#### **BOARD CALENDAR**

After conclusion of the public review period, the TPB and Executive Boards will review any proposed changes at their February, March, and April meetings. The boards are scheduled to act in April to recommend that PSRC's General Assembly adopt the plan at their meeting in May 2026.

#### DISCUSSION

Over the last 20 months, steady progress has been made towards the development of the next RTP. This has included identification of key policy priorities and adoption of the plan's scope of work; publication of a <u>Current Transportation System Report</u>; discussion of future proposed investments and the plan's financial strategy; a summary of ongoing outreach and engagement; and briefings on key plan topics.

At the November meeting, the TPB provided direction regarding the plan's financial strategy, details and supportive materials for which can be found in the TPB's November agenda packet.

Staff reviewed of each of the elements to be included or addressed in the draft plan, as well as the plan's structure. Topics included active transportation; climate; safety; health; transit access; maintenance and preservation; the financial strategy; the Coordinated Mobility Plan, which addresses the needs for people with mobility challenges; and a comprehensive system performance report. The board also reviewed summaries of key themes heard at the six regional public meetings held this fall.

In November, the TPB was introduced to the <u>Future Transportation System Report</u>, which describes each element of the region's proposed future transportation system, including planned investments, key data and trends, and, where applicable, a high-level summary of identified system gaps. These gaps stem from the disconnect between where people and jobs are in the future compared to the planned future transportation system.

The TPB was also provided with a demonstration of the <u>Current and Future</u> <u>Transportation System Visualization Tools</u>, which contain interactive maps and databases that describe the current system, as well as the mappable regional capacity projects included in the selected plan scenario.

The draft plan is scheduled for release the week of December 15<sup>th</sup>, after which a public comment period running through the month of January.

After conclusion of the public comment period, the TPB and Executive Boards will review any proposed changes at their February, March, and April meetings. The boards are scheduled to act in April to recommend that PSRC's General Assembly adopt the plan at their meeting in May 2026.
