CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Chair Executive Ryan Mello called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. and welcomed members and attendees. The meeting was held in a hybrid format, with options for in-person and remote participation.

Chair Mello acknowledged outgoing committee member Mayor Becky Erickson for her extraordinary service to the region.

Roll was determined there was a quorum present.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

CONSENT AGENDA – ACTION ITEMS

ACTION: It was moved (Wahl/Simpson) to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion passed.

DISCUSSION ITEM: DRAFT SUPPLEMENTAL BIENNIAL BUDGET AND WORK PROGRAM (FY2026–2027)

Andrew Werfelmann, PSRC, provided an overview of the draft supplemental biennial budget and work program for fiscal years 2026–2027. The full draft is posted on PSRC's website. The agency will begin outreach to policy boards and the Executive Board in January for review and comment. Andrew noted a slight decrease in overall budget

numbers compared to October. This is due to subrecipient invoices for Safe Streets and Roads for All grants, which were attributed to the previous fiscal year. There is no impact on agency operations.

DISCUSSION ITEM: REVIEW OUTREACH COMPENSATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Marc Daily, PSRC, shared that PSRC first adopted its outreach compensation policies and procedures in 2020 to improve engagement from underrepresented populations. The policy has been previously amended to expand eligible activities, clarify payment options and include compensation for community-based organizations. The policy calls for review by the committee every three years. Staff have internally reviewed the policy and are not proposing amendments at this time.

Dr. Charles Patton, PSRC, provided an update on outcomes, noting the policy has been instrumental in attracting and retaining high-quality Equity Advisory Committee members, fostering trust and improving engagement. Committee members discussed the value of the policy and expressed interest in learning more about implementation, with suggestions for future workshops or toolkits to share best practices with member jurisdictions.

The committee did not propose any changes to the policy and will review it again in 2028 unless interim amendments are proposed.

**A RESOLUTION of the Puget Sound Regional Council
Appointing of Auditing Officer(s) for the Purpose of Authorizing the Issuance of
Warrants and Electronic Transactions Prior to Board Approval**

WHEREAS, there may be circumstances when the Board does not meet prior to a day in which they would need to approve vouchers for the Council's warrants and claims;

WHEREAS, there is a need by the Puget Sound Regional Council to process warrants and electronic payments in a timely and consistent manner;

WHEREAS, it would be of financial benefit to appoint Auditing Officer(s) to certify the voucher approval document for the correct and certified submission of vouchers to the King County Finance Office without awaiting a Board meeting to authorize specific payments;

WHEREAS, RCW 42.24.180 authorizes the issuance of warrants before approval of the vouchers by the Board in order to expedite the payment of claims;

WHEREAS, this Agency shall enact the following policies and procedures pursuant to RCW 42.24.180:

1. All routine operating claims against Puget Sound Regional Council will be pre-audited and signed by the Auditing Officer
2. The Auditing Officer shall be bonded for no less than \$50,000 to assure the faithful discharge of their duties
3. PSRCs Accounting Procedures establishes the necessary purchasing and disbursing procedures that implements effective internal control for issuance of warrants and claims
4. The Board shall review and approve the claims paid at its next regularly scheduled public meeting; and
5. If the Board disapproves some claims, the Auditing Officer will recognize these claims as receivables and will pursue collection diligently until the amounts are either collected or the Board approves the claims.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Board of Puget Sound Regional Council does hereby authorize the Auditing Officer(s), Josh Brown, Marc Daily, Lili Mayer, and Andrew Werfelmann to submit vouchers for payment and disbursement in accordance with PSRC's accounting procedures prior to the Board taking action to approve said claims.

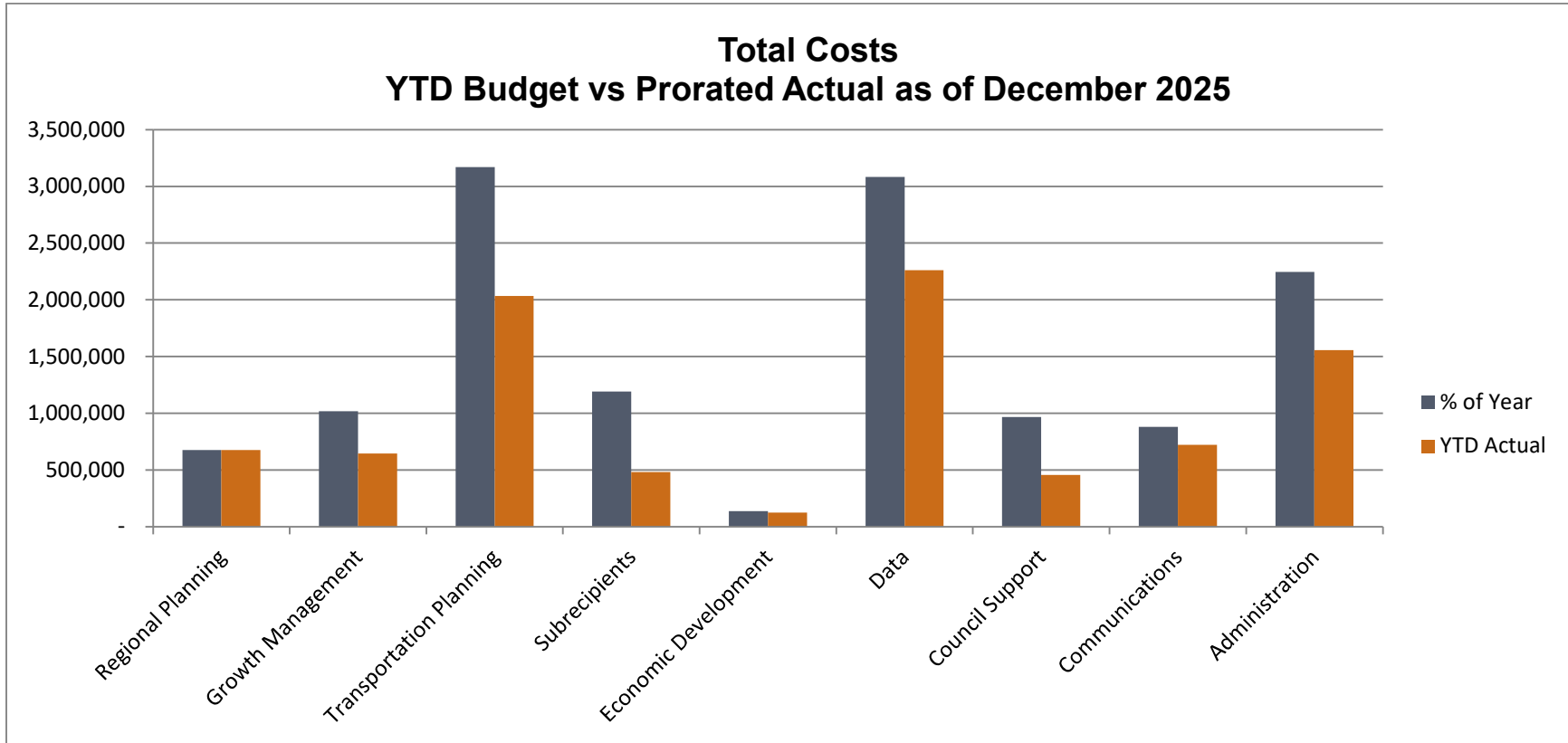
Subject: **Fiscal Year 2025 Audit Results for the Puget Sound Regional Council and the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District**

On February 18, 2026, the State Auditor's Office (SAO) held their annual exit conference via Teams. At the exit conference, the SAO presented the results of their audit of both PSRC and CPSEDD. Staff expect that the final audit report for both PSRC and CPSEDD will reflect clean audits with no findings, management letters or exit items to report.

Budget as of September 2025 Amended Biennial Budget.

Percent of Year represents the amount of expenses that each department should have based on the current month of the fiscal year as it relates to the department’s annual budget. 50% of the fiscal year has been completed.

45.0% of labor, 14.0% of consultant budget not including Safe Streets and Roads for All Subrecipients, and 37.8% of direct budget has been expensed.

20.2% of total Subrecipient budget has been expensed for both Safe Streets and Roads for All programs. Grants run for 5 years.

Most of the consultant budget has not been expensed.

Regional Planning expenses include the annual Summer Planning Academy which is beginning of year expenditure.

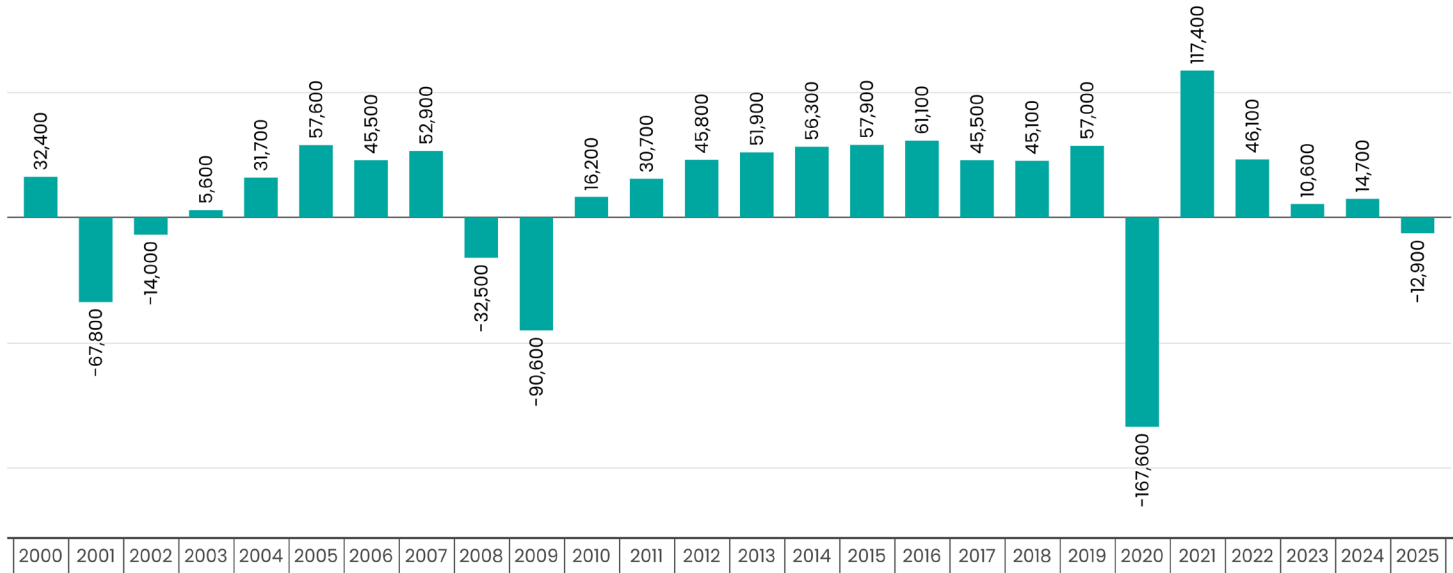

Economic Update: Puget Sound Region Loses 12,900 jobs in 2025

Jobs data reported for King, Pierce, Snohomish and Kitsap counties

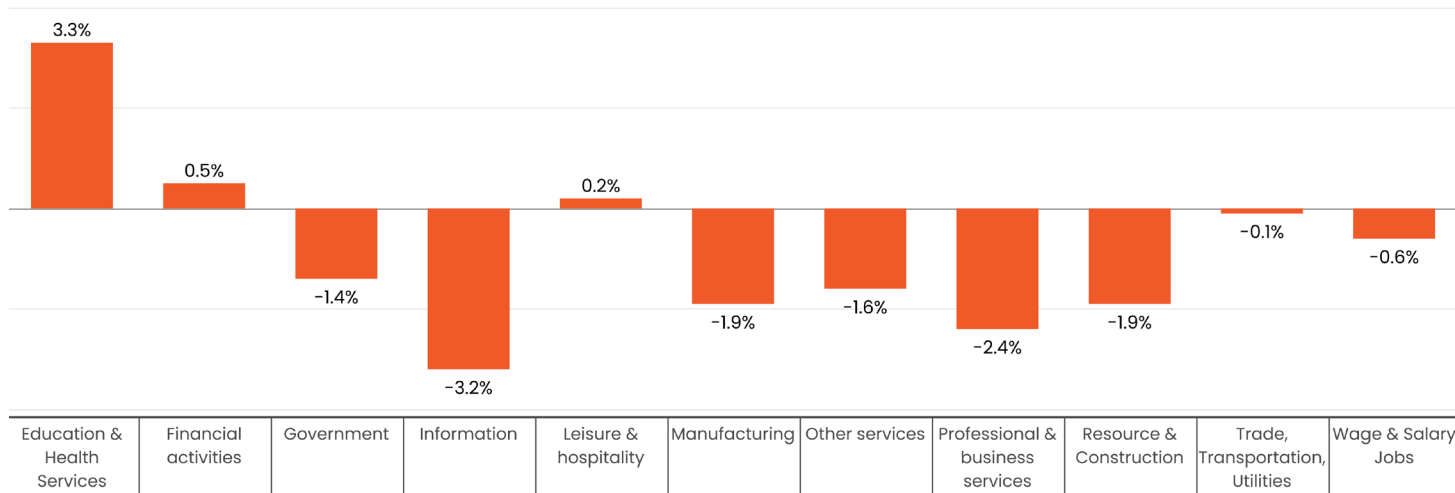
In 2025, the central Puget Sound region lost 12,900 jobs. If you exclude the anomaly of the COVID-19 pandemic, this is the first time the region has experienced an annual decrease of jobs since 2009, during the depths of the Great Recession.

The loss of 12,900 jobs in 2025 comes on the heels of slowing regional job growth in 2023 (10,600 jobs added) and 2024 (14,700 jobs added).

Historically, jobs in the Puget Sound region have grown by between 30,000-40,000 jobs per year. Employment growth during the Amazon boom was significantly higher, peaking at 61,100 jobs added in 2016.

The sectors hit hardest by losses are construction and service industry jobs, which includes tech. Job growth continued in the health care sector. Monthly job data disaggregated by individual industry is not available.

Regional Economic Strategy

PSRC is working with partners to craft a new Regional Economic Strategy that will align regional efforts to boost economic growth. Regional leaders are exploring strategies to support job growth as part of the plan. The plan will be adopted in December 2026 and focus on expanding economic opportunity, business climate, global competition and quality of life.
