Jean Kim, PSRC, provided a presentation on microtransit projects that participated in the past regional priority ranking process. She shared how PSRC defines microtransit and the current status of microtransit services across the region. Jean facilitated a discussion to identify CMAC's guidance on how microtransit projects should be treated within the regional priority ranking process. The committee provided feedback, and PSRC will prepare a staff proposal in March for CMAC's review.

Kellee Harwood, PSRC, shared the history of regional priority ranking distribution in the past cycles and metrics for capital vehicle replacement and purchase projects. Information was derived from the statewide Consolidated Grant application. Jean Kim, PSRC, facilitated the committee discussion on what performance metrics should be used to evaluate and prioritize unique vehicle replacement requests and asked for any additional metrics that should be assessed for PSRC's evaluation. CMAC provided feedback and PSRC will prepare a staff proposal in March for review.
