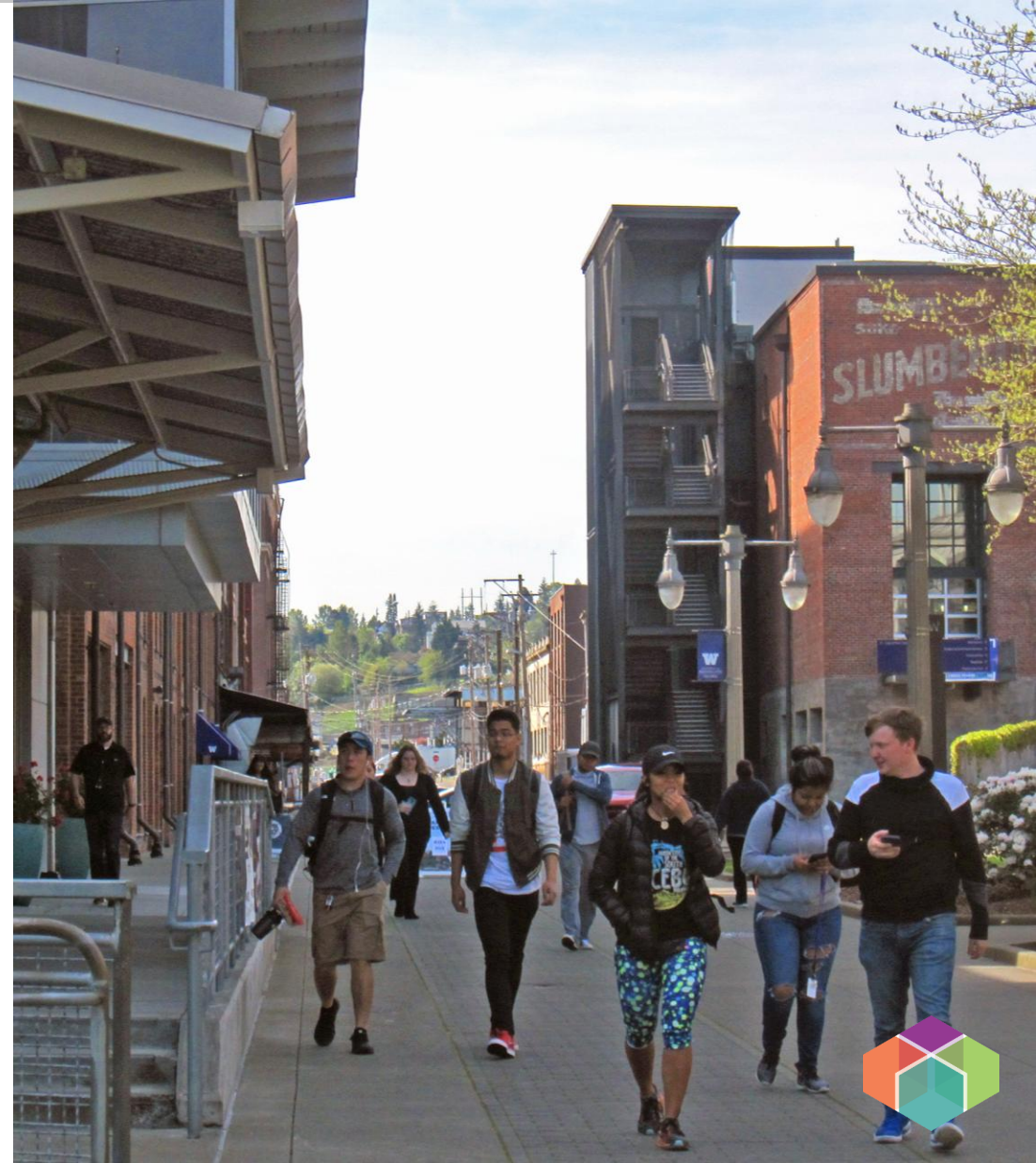

Background

Key part of VISION 2050 and the Regional Growth Strategy



Guide regional growth allocations



Advance local planning



Inform transit service planning



Protects rural and natural resource areas



Priority areas for PSRC's federal transportation funding

30 Regional Growth Centers

10 Manufacturing/
Industrial Centers



What is a Regional Growth Center?

A regional growth center is a **walkable neighborhood with frequent transit**. These areas are planning for more housing and jobs.

Shopping centers

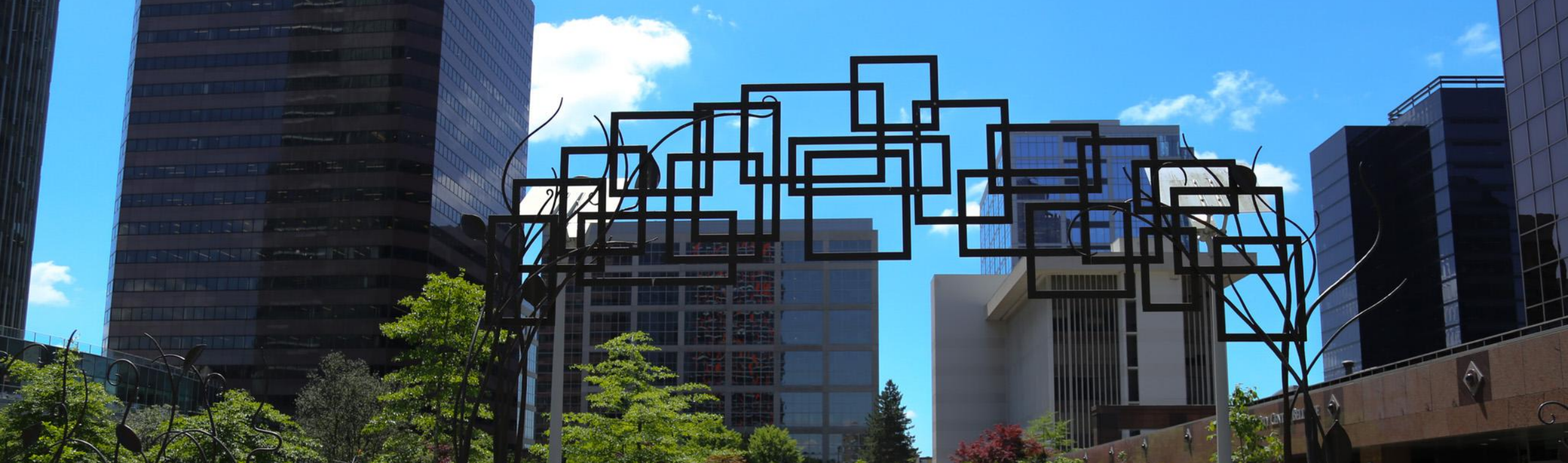


Regional Centers Framework

2018 Regional Centers Framework

- Establishes criteria and planning expectations for regional centers
- Monitoring and redesignation process in 2025
- Process to designate countywide centers





Regional Centers Framework Draft Scope



Project Purpose



Purpose:

- Consistency with new state laws for TOD and housing
- Address insights from redesignation and systems monitoring

Update will inform:

- New centers application window (2027)
- VISION 2050 update

Density & TOD

Review existing & planned densities

Evaluate consistency with HB 1491 (density near transit)

Housing

Address housing types & affordability

Evaluate consistency with new state laws

Livable Communities

Encourage unique sense of place & livable centers

Boundaries & Connectivity

Size, shape, addressing areas divided by highways

Board directed exception policy



Draft Scope: Manufacturing/Industrial Centers

Economic Shifts

Evaluate shifts of demand within MICs

Assess employment impacts

Compatible Uses

Reevaluate definition of “core industrial” zoning

Environmental Impacts

Research & guidance on disproportionate community impacts

Admin & Other Topics

Updates to process or criteria

Equity Advisory Committee input on subarea planning



Committee & Countywide Groups: What We Heard

- Support for the scope of work
- Support for a focused update given other requirements
