- Adopted by General Assembly May 28
- PSRC staff developing work programs to implement the Regional Transportation Plan & Coordinated Mobility Plan

Ongoing Engagement with Communities

Goals:

- Coordinate engagement for future Coordinated Mobility Plan along with other PSRC engagement efforts
- Engage with community groups more frequently during and between plan development years



Data Needs/Tools

Goals:

- Consistently track performance measures towards regional goals
- Provide data and resources needed for regional partners
- Emphasize the importance of addressing priority populations



High Priority Strategy Topics

- Strengthen **cross-county and cross-agency** coordination to ensure a more seamless travel experience.
- Improve the **reliability and responsiveness** by improving dispatch systems and real-time communication.
- Support **context-appropriate transportation options** for rural and other areas with limited transit.
- Conduct **mobility management programs** that help riders navigate transportation options.
- Expand and optimize transportation to improve **access to healthcare and other essential service** locations.
- Improve the **accessibility and safety of infrastructure**.
- Identify and pursue **coordinated, sustainable funding strategies** to maintain/expand transportation serving priority populations.
