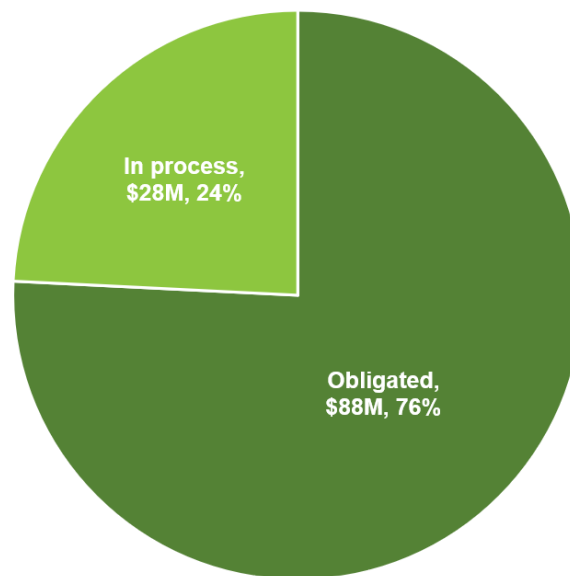
REGIONAL PROJECT EVALUATION COMMITTEE – JULY 2026 INFORMATION ITEMS

Following is the status of PSRC Transportation work program items currently underway.

PROJECT DELIVERY

Our region's 2026 Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) allocations have been confirmed, and major actions in PSRC's rebalancing and delivery of projects have been completed. All projects with 2026 delivery have submitted obligation paperwork and about \$88 million in PSRC funds have completed obligation or are awaiting final signature. Current delivery status is summarized as follows.

Sponsors of projects still in process are asked to remain diligent and are expected to address any outstanding review comments in a timely manner, so that obligation is ready for final signature as soon as possible. 2026 FUNDING COMPETITIONS

PSRC's Rural Town Centers and Corridors (RTCC) Program and Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) competitions have been completed, with recommendations from the respective project selection committees recommended for approval by the Transportation Policy Board at their July 10 meeting, and final action by the Executive Board scheduled for their July 23 meeting.

The RTCC Program was established by PSRC to recognize and support the needs of the region's rural areas and provides funding for projects in smaller rural towns and cities—approximately \$6 million in RTCC funds was recommended for award. TAP is an FHWA funding program for community-based transportation improvements, such as bicycle and pedestrian facilities, historic preservation of transportation assets, and environmental mitigation—approximately \$16 million in TAP funds was recommended for award. Any projects not awarded funding at this time will be placed on prioritized contingency lists should additional funds become available.
