WSDOT Consolidated Grant in 2020

Review of 2020 Consolidated Grant Results:

- PSRC received 13 applications (one agency submitted 6 applications)
- \$3.2M requested for 2021-23 and \$2.8M requested for 2021-25
- 10 projects received regional priority rankings worth points (2A's, 3B's, 5C's)
- WSDOT awarded 12 projects for the PSRC region
- \$3.1M funded for 2021-23 and \$2.8M funded for 2021-25

Upcoming 2022 Consolidated Grant:

- Call for projects expected in July 2022
- Anticipate 15 rankings available:
 - 5 A's = 50 pts
 - 5 B's = 25 pts
 - 5 C's = 12 pts

NOTE: Four-year projects will receive the same grade for both biennia

Less funding amount expected compared to the 2020 competition



- Applicants within the PSRC region are expected to address both WSDOT's evaluation criteria and PSRC's regional priority factors within the same application
 - PSRC's regional priority ranking factors are designed to help implement PSRC's Coordinated Plan
- PSRC staff will review applications for how they address the regional priority ranking factors
- PSRC will share the result with SNTC and interested parties a week prior to the deliberations
- Projects will receive a simple "Yes" or "No" answer for each factor:
 - A "Yes" indicates that the project application addresses the factor
 - A "No" response indicates that a project application either does not address the factor or does not adequately address it

Final regional priority rankings will be discussed and determined at the SNTC Deliberation meeting, using "Additional Considerations" developed by the committee



Project Type (Preservation vs. New/Expansion)

- Evaluation Question: Is the application for preservation or to support ongoing operations of an existing program? This includes fleet replacement or other capital needs to support an existing program.
- Evaluation Method: Only preservation and capital projects that are supporting existing programs will receive a "Yes."



Support for PSRC's Coordinated Mobility Plan

- Evaluation Question: Does the application support PSRC's Coordinated Plan by addressing at least one of the "Emerging Needs and Gaps" and at least one "High Prioritized Strategy" as identified in the Coordinated Plan?
- Evaluation Method: Only applications that the project adequately addresses at least one "Emerging Needs and Gaps" as well as at least one "High Prioritized Strategy" will receive a "Yes."



Uniqueness of Service

- Evaluation Question: Does the application provide information demonstrating that there are no other operating or mobility management programs serving the same populations within the same geographic area? If there are other programs and services, does the application demonstrate the uniqueness of the project?
- Evaluation Method: Applicants that adequately explain the uniqueness of their services will receive a "Yes."



Performance Measures and Targets

- Evaluation Question: Does the application commit to tracking required, project-specific performance measures and set grant-cycle-related targets for those performance measures?
- Evaluation Method: If the applicant commits to tracking required performance measures and sets targets for those required performance measures, the applicant will receive a "Yes" for this factor.



Financial Sustainability

- Evaluation Question: Does the application demonstrate that it is providing more than federal minimum required match from local sources in its project budget?
- Evaluation Method: Operating projects seeking a federal/state funding amount less than 50% of their net project cost will receive a "Yes." Capital and mobility management projects seeking a federal/state funding amount less than 80% of their net project cost will receive a "Yes."



Additional Considerations for Deliberation

Geographical Distribution of Regional Rankings

This factor addresses the distribution of regional priority rankings (expressed as A's, B's, and C's) over the three counties participating in the Consolidated Grant competition in the region.

Project Types

 This factor addresses the variety of project types being recommended for regional priority ranking (e.g., mobility management, operating, and capital projects).

Agency Equity

This factor addresses the number of projects recommended to receive funding by an agency.



Additional Considerations for Deliberation

Compelling Cases for Agencies with Limited Resources

 This factor addresses projects that provide valued services and programs, but which are challenged to provide the minimum local match. Small agencies and/or communitybased organizations might have less local support compared to larger agencies that have local partners providing sufficient local matching funds or local governments/transit agencies that have their own tax bases.

Strategic Application of State/Federal Funds

 This factor includes stakeholders' assessment of possible program eligibility for state/federal funding programs found within the Consolidated Grant program.

Coordination

 This factor addresses projects that work together to make the most efficient use of limited resources. There are many levels of coordination, ranging from the basic sharing of training resources to the full integration of services. The Committee can discuss the full range of coordination for this topic.

Other Ideas

Sponsor presentations

PSRC recommends project sponsor presentations for the upcoming competitions. SNTC members will be able to ask questions about the project and increase their understanding of the projects before the deliberation.

Prioritizing equity

How can we ensure that equity is prioritized in this process? For example, we could ask project sponsors to describe how their projects provide benefits to equity focus populations within the service area (potentially with demographic or other data).
