Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Welcome and Introduction to Online Meeting Format

Geri Poor, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present. Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, announced that as there were some vacancies on the roster, including the Vice Chair position, she would be reaching out via email to solicit the committee regarding the vacant positions.

Paul Inghram, PSRC, provided a briefing on the update to the Industrial Lands Report, including an overview of the process, considerations, engagement plan, and project schedule. Action: NHFP Funding Process

Jennifer reviewed the 2022 Critical Urban Freight Corridor (CUFC) and National Highway Freight Program (NHFP) funding process and then provided a briefing on the freight projects identified by members to submit for WSDOT's National Highway Freight Program (NHFP) funding competition. She then reviewed the next steps in the NHFP process which included PSRC submitting the completed project forms to WSDOT in mid-March (March 16) after which a list of candidate freight projects will be presented for review by PSRC's Transportation Policy Board and Executive Board at their respective March meetings. The committee reviewed and briefly discussed each project on the list of eight projects received.

Dana Brown, City of Tacoma, asked if a late request from the City of Tacoma could be made to add a project to the list, and discussed two potential projects of which the City would select one to be added. The committee was asked to concur with this proposal from the City of Tacoma, and the committee unanimously concurred. The committee was then asked to review and accept the project list as shown with the understanding that the Tacoma project would be added after the meeting. The committee discussed and unanimously approved the list and Tacoma addition.

Discussion: CUFC/CRFC Designation Process

Jennifer provided a short overview of next steps for the broader Critical Urban Freight Corridor/ Critical Rural Freight Corridor (CUFC/CRFC) designation process. She reviewed the proposed schedule which included a form to be sent by PSRC within the next month to identify candidate corridors for CUFC designation. She said the form would be due prior to the next FAC meeting, to be compiled and reviewed/finalized by the FAC at the April 13 meeting. If needed a special May meeting will be scheduled to finalize the committee's recommendation. She noted the final recommended CUFC list would then go to the Boards for approval, to then be added to the statewide list for WSDOT/FHWA later in the summer. The committee was asked to discuss the schedule and process and provide any additional comments.
