Welcome and Introduction to Online Meeting Format

Geri Poor, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

Action: Approval of Meeting Summary

The February 9, 2022 meeting summary was approved as presented.

Action: CUFC Designation Process - Recommendation for the CUFC Designations

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, provided a brief overview of the 2022 CUFC designation/NHFP funding processes and overall Critical Urban Freight Corridor (CUFC) designation process and timeline. She reminded the committee that the review of the candidate CUFC segment list and the criteria/considerations to apply to reduce the list, was to adhere to the region's mileage limit and apply those considerations to determine the committee's recommended CUFC list for the region. She noted that if needed, a special May meeting has been scheduled to conclude the committee's recommendation if there was not enough time to complete the finalization of the list at this meeting.

The committee members reviewed and discussed the candidate CUFC segment list, as well as criteria/considerations to apply to reduce the list but did not have enough time to finalize the list for a recommendation. Jennifer then went over the next steps which would be to refine the list at the special May 11 meeting, and then come to a consensus for a recommendation to the Transportation Policy Board meeting in June.
