Regional Project Evaluation Committee Meeting Summary

Date: December 3, 2021 from 9:30 a.m.-11:00 a.m.

Location: Remote – Online Meeting Only (Zoom Connection)

Introductions, Review of Meeting Procedures and Announcements

Doug McCormick, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. and then took a roll call to confirm the members and alternates present.

Approval of Meeting Summary

The October 22, 2021, RPEC meeting summary was approved as presented.

Transportation Policy Board Debrief

Doug and Kelly McGourty, PSRC, reviewed the Transportation Policy Board meeting held on Thursday, November 10, 2021. The 'At Work' report for this meeting is available on the PSRC website at: https://www.psrc.org/tpb-meetings.

Discussion: Project Selection Task Force - Debrief and Next Steps

Kelly provided an overview of the final meeting of the Project Selection Task Force on November 10th and the next steps leading up to the 2022 project selection process. She reviewed the finalization of the project selection criteria, administrative elements, and the hardship policy within the project tracking policies. She noted a summary of the project selection criteria would be sent later in December for public comment per the request of the Task Force. Josh Diekmann, City of Tacoma, provided information on a new proposal related to addressing Tribal Employment Rights Ordinances within "Other Considerations" of the criteria. Josh reviewed the proposal, and the committee discussed and provided comments. It was decided that an email would be sent out to RPEC members with additional information to get a consensus from the members whether the proposal should be added. Kelly noted as this proposal would be added to the "Other Considerations" of the criteria, there would be no points allocated.

Discussion: Project Tracking and Delivery

Kelly reported that the final 2021 obligation delivery target was met but emphasized that a great deal of effort and work had to be done to accomplish this. She reviewed upcoming challenges that could cause concern for future project delivery, such as changes to stormwater rules that may affect project timelines and noted that the United States Department of Transportation requirements remained unchanged as well. Stephanie Tax, WSDOT, provided additional insights on some ways to avoid delivery issues, such as ensuring project schedules and resources remain realistic. The committee was asked if opportunities for education and engagement with project sponsors would be helpful to re-

evaluate the process and assist with project deliveries. The committee discussed and provided suggestions, including formation of a future subgroup for further discussion.

Doug noted that he recently attended a hybrid meeting and that it was a unique experience, and was somewhat complicated to put together.

Peter Heffernan, King County, asked if the Project Selection evaluation process would be affected in any way in a hybrid environment, and if there would be any potential difficulties for some jurisdictions and agencies to participate. Kelly noted that a remote option would always be available for any participants that could not come in to the PSRC office.
