- RTP foundation:
  - Significant expansion of high-capacity transit
  - > Focus on safety, equity, climate, access to transit
- RTP and equity topics discussed to date:
  - Regional equity analysis
  - Coordinated Mobility Plan age, income and ability
  - Community outreach and engagement
  - Performance metrics



#### **EAC** Feedback to Date

- From January March 2022 meetings, topics of:
  - Data and analysis improvements
  - Outreach improvements
  - Health and safety
  - > Terminology



- Data and analysis improvements:
  - affordability
  - impacts of COVID-19
  - displacement
  - walk distance to transit
  - travel and wait times



- Data and analysis improvements Next steps:
  - Ongoing improvements to PSRC modeling and analyses
  - Continued and further engagement with communities, staff committees and other stakeholders
  - Review of household travel survey and additional data related to COVID and future travel conditions
  - RTP board member amendments under consideration
    - Elevating importance of ADA planning and implementation, expanding PSRC's role

- Outreach improvements:
  - increase outreach with Tribal partners
  - use short videos, in multiple languages
  - allow feedback via text
  - explore outreach opportunities that don't require virtual / internet use
  - encourage member agencies to support residents with limited English proficiency to fully use transportation resources



- Outreach improvements Next steps:
  - Commitment to continued improvements in future outreach and engagement efforts
  - Sharing of best practices and innovations with member agencies, including transit agencies



- Health and safety:
  - encourage transit agencies to consider future COVID-19 variants when designing buses
  - expand the Special Needs Transportation Committee to include health care representatives
  - transit stations aren't welcoming, lack amenities
  - emphasize the needs of equity focus areas as part of strengthening the partnership and coordination between transportation and health care providers



- Health and safety Next steps:
  - PSRC will share these comments with our transit agency partners
  - The Safety element of the draft plan will be reviewed, and language strengthened regarding personal health and safety
  - Partnerships will continue with health departments, with pursuit of representation on the Special Needs Transportation Committee



#### Terminology:

- Review terms and language used and remove outdated references
- Next steps:
  - The RTP will be reviewed for any outdated terms
  - PSRC will work with our mobility partners and the Special Needs Transportation Committee on appropriate and current terminology



#### Other Related Board Amendments to the RTP

- Provide greater clarity and details on work program related to displacement risks
- Provide greater clarity and details on the equity analysis work of the RTP and funding competitions
- Develop a regional safety plan
- Improve understanding and assessment of "all ages and abilities" bicycle and pedestrian facilities

- April 14: Transportation Policy Board review of amendments, recommendation on final draft plan
- April 28: Executive Board review of draft plan as amended, final recommendation on plan to General Assembly
  - May 12 meeting if needed
- May 26: General Assembly adoption of Regional Transportation Plan
