

Project Location










Local and Regional Policy Support



- Consistent with WSDOT Long-Range Corridor Improvement Project
- Supports City of Sultan Growth Targets
- Improves safety and efficiencies for all users
- Provides multimodal access for all users

Relationship to Other Planned US-2 Projects





Safety and Multimodal Benefits

- Identified in Sultan's 2020 Local Road Safety Plan as a Highest Priority US 2 Corridor Safety Improvement Project
- Roundabout increases safety over minor approach stop control for all users

Non-motorized Users

- Provides opportunity to cross US-2 safely to access regional transit stops and local businesses.
- Provides Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) crossings to enhance pedestrian safety and ADA requirements

Motor Vehicles

- Reduces vehicle/vehicle conflicts and speeds to reducing fatal and serious injury crashes over 75%
- Supports U-Turns for access management




Regional Transportation Benefits

- Compatible with Multiple Corridor Alternatives
- Supports Corridor Wide Access Management
- Improves Safety for All Modes
- Creates Community Gateway at Main Street

Project Readiness



- Technical analysis complete for multiple corridor alternatives consistent with this proposed roundabout project
- WSDOT Channelization Plan development currently underway
- Local matching funds in hand; project is included in City's Transportation Impact Fee program
- Community Engagement program for the entire US 2 Corridor through the City of Sultan (3 miles) to begin first quarter 2022

Project Cost Estimate

Sultan's secured contribution (20%) exceeds minimum requirement.
