## **UPDATE ON THE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN**

**In Brief:** At the May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting, PSRC staff will continue discussion on potential bicycle and pedestrian-related work program items arising from the draft 2022-2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) scheduled for adoption on May 26, 2022.

**Discussion:** At the May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting, staff will initiate discussion on topics included in the draft RTP related to bicycle and pedestrian planning and access to transit. Although the draft RTP is in the process of being amended at the board level, and the final document is not scheduled for adoption until May 26, staff would like to solicit committee feedback on the following topics:

- Access to transit: This is a thematic element throughout the draft RTP. PSRC developed tools and resources associated with this topic in the 2013-2018 timeframe. Staff have continued to work together with local jurisdictions, transit agencies and the state to advance this work. We are interested in hearing from a bicycle and pedestrian planning perspective how this topic can continue to be advanced in the future.
- Mobility needs from the Coordinated Mobility Plan: Staff conducted extensive outreach to people with disabilities, people with low-incomes, older adults, youth, and other people with mobility challenges to develop the draft Coordinated Mobility Plan incorporated as part of the draft RTP. One of the mobility needs identified in this document was improving bicycle and pedestrian facilities needed to access transit services. Continued discussion at the PSRC Equity Advisory Committee and the board has continued to emphasize the need to address the mobility needs of the populations covered in this plan. Staff would like to initiate discussion on how this information can be used to address transit access needs.
- Bicycle and pedestrian facility data: Over the past few years, staff have been
  working with the BPAC and local jurisdictions to collect data on existing
  conditions for bicycle and pedestrian transportation in the region, including
  existing facilities, travel patterns and policies and regulation for building new
  infrastructure. This information was used to present key findings on walking and
  biking in the draft RTP and to build the <u>Transportation System Existing</u>
  Conditions Tool. At this meeting, staff would like to continue the discussion on
  how to maintain, improve and analyze the data inventories going forward.

Staff are seeking initial BPAC feedback on these topics through short discussions on each item at the May meeting. Please come to the meeting prepared to provide feedback on these topics. As time allows, we can talk about additional topics of interest to members.
