Census Bureau Data Products

Census publishes 130+ data products

Commonly Used Data in Local Planning

- Decennial Census
- American Community Survey (ACS)



2020 Decennial Census Data Products - Redistricting Data

Redistricting Data:

- Information states need to redraw/redistrict their legislative boundaries
- Redistricting data includes block-level counts of the population by:
 - Race
 - Ethnicity (Hispanic or Latino origin)
 - Voting age

- Housing occupancy status
- Group quarters population

Timelines:

- Redistricting data files released on September 2021
- Official corrections & other data to be released mid-2023



The ACS and the Decennial Census

How are they different?

	ACS	Decennial Census
Purpose	Sample estimates	Official counts
Collects	Detailed social, economic, housing, and demographic characteristics	Basic demographics
Produces	Population and housing characteristics – Trends and comparisons	Population and housing totals
New Data Every	Year	10 years
Data Reflect	Period of time 1 year* and 5 years	Point in time

Types of ACS Tables

Data Profiles

 Most frequently requested social, economic, housing, and demographic data

Subject/Detailed Tables

- Dive deeper to answer more complex questions
 - e.g., Poverty status in the last 12 months

What if I can't find what I need?

- Consider using either the 1-Year or 5-Year vintage of ACS
- Larger jurisdictions could consider PUMS (Public Use Microdata Sample)


