CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m. by Chair Prince.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comments

CHAIR'S REPORT

Chair Prince announced a save the date notice for a joint board session on racial equity scheduled for Thursday, June 23 from 10:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. Chair Prince shared updates related to the board membership:

- Jennifer Anderson with the Master Builders of King and Snohomish Counties has changed from alternate to member.
- Patience Malaba, board member with the Housing Development Consortium of Seattle-King County, has transitioned into the role of the Executive Director.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director of Growth Management Paul Inghram announced updates from the Legislature including bills relevant to growth management. Mr. Inghram shared information on the Economic Development Element Guide, the status of the Regional Transportation Plan, and VISION 2050 booklets and hard copies being available to board members.

CONSENT AGENDA

a. Approve Minutes of Growth Management Policy Board Meeting held March 3, 2022

<u>ACTION</u>: It was moved and seconded (Wahl/Dunn) to adopt the Consent Agenda. Motion passed.

RECOMMEND CERTIFICATION OF CANYON PARK RGC SUBAREA PLAN

Senior Planner Maggie Moore presented on the Canyon Park Regional Growth Center subarea plan. Ms. Moore provided an overview of the work the city has done, including preparing for more housing to utilize the current Swift bus line and the future Stride bus line. Highlights include encouraging the development of a diverse range of market rate and affordable housing, retaining flexible and affordable commercial spaces, and creating through-block connections with proposed new development.

<u>ACTION</u>: It was moved and seconded (Wahl/Dunn) to recommend the Executive Board certify that the Canyon Park RGC subarea plan addresses planning expectations for regional growth centers. Motion passed.

RECOMMEND CERTIFICATION OF SNOHOMISH COUNTY COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES

Principal Planner Liz Underwood-Bultmann provided an overview of the countywide planning policies and growth targets process. Ms. Underwood-Bultmann highlighted the county's work to reflect the multicounty planning policies and Regional Growth Strategy in VISION 2050. Snohomish County collaborated with the cities in the county through Snohomish County Tomorrow to complete the update.

<u>ACTION</u>: It was moved and seconded (Wahl/Dunn) to recommend the Executive Board to certify that the Countywide Planning Policies for Snohomish County are consistent with the multicounty planning policies and the regional transportation plan. Motion passed.

REGIONAL TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE

Senior Planner Laura Benjamin provided an update on the Regional Transit-Oriented Development Committee (RTODC). The committee is comprised of 21 technical experts and serves as an advisory committee to the board and is focused on implementing TOD-related goals. Boardmember and RTODC Co-Chair Patience Malaba shared the committee is focused on working proactively to plan for growth, use the investments in transit, and have TOD be available for all people.

CONSERVATION TOOLKIT FOR PROTECTING FARMS, FORESTS, OPEN SPACE, AND RURAL LANDS

Senior Planner Erika Harris highlighted tools from the conservation toolkit including education and assistance programs, incentive programs, and stewardship on public lands. Other tools for cities include Transfer of Development Rights and Landscape Conservation and Local Infrastructure Program that can help fund city infrastructure. Ms. Harris provided a Stormwater Parks Project update including that the City of Puyallup was selected as the last jurisdiction to receive a technical assistance grant.

PUGET SOUND DATA TRENDS

Director of Data Craig Helmann presented on population, housing production, jobs/unemployment, retail sales trends, and transit and travel trends, focusing on impacts of the pandemic.

Chair Prince announced the next meeting is scheduled for May 5, 2022.
