




Snoqualmie Valley

- 70% live more than one mile from fixed route service










The Spine of the Valley

- Suggested donation of \$1






Circulator Routes

- Developed through careful examination of the demand responsive requests







Demand Response

- · Eligible to all
- Lifts and bike racks
- Call to arrange in advance







Funding request

- Requesting:
- \$1,110,971 for 23-25
- Against \$3,188.971 in expenses
- 2.13% increase over21-23 biennium

Matching Revenue:

- Mt. Si Senior Center provides \$1,9m in revenue
- Includes \$188k in local in-kind support
- \$250,000 from the Snoqualmie Tribe
- Match is 65%
