





Principles of the Safe System Approach

- Death and serious injuries are unacceptable.
- Humans make mistakes.
- Humans are vulnerable.
- Responsibility is shared.
- Safety is proactive.
- Redundancy is crucial.

THE SAFE SYSTEM APPROACH VS. TRADITIONAL ROAD SAFETY PRACTICES

Traditional

Prevent crashes — Prevent deaths and serious injuries

Improve human behavior — Design for human mistakes/limitations

Control speeding — Reduce system kinetic energy

Individuals are responsible — Share responsibility

React based on crash history — Proactively identify and address risks

Whereas traditional road safety strives to modify human behavior and prevent all crashes, the Safe System approach also refocuses transportation system design and operation on anticipating human mistakes and lessening impact forces to reduce crash severity and save lives.



- Not accepting loss of life
- Focusing on survivability, not crashes
- Selecting the right intervention
- Sharing responsibility
- Thinking systemically and working proactively
