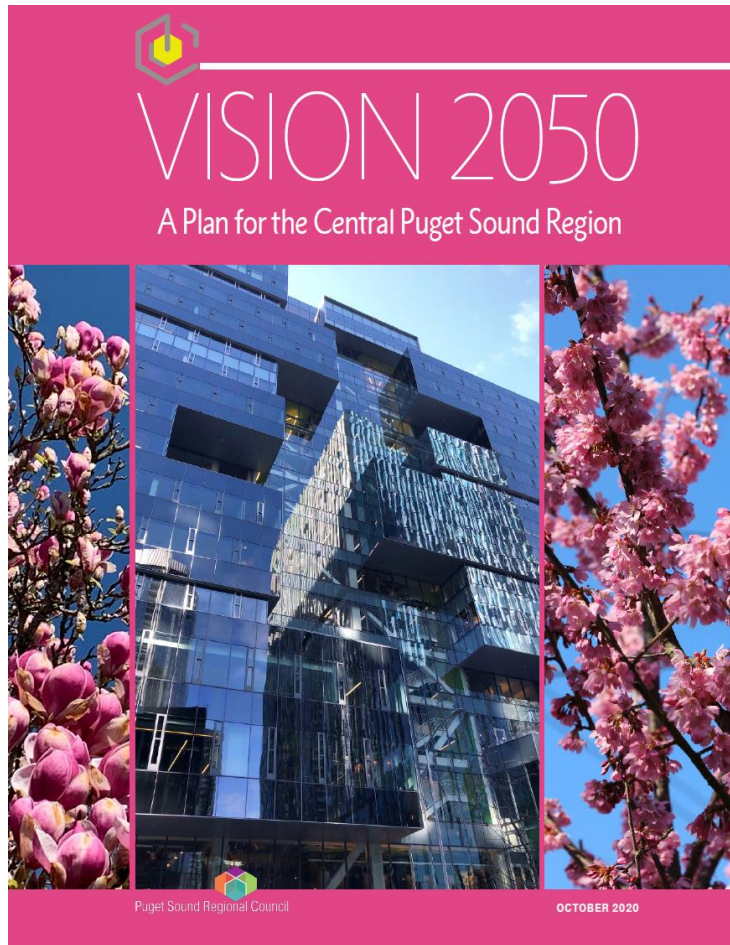

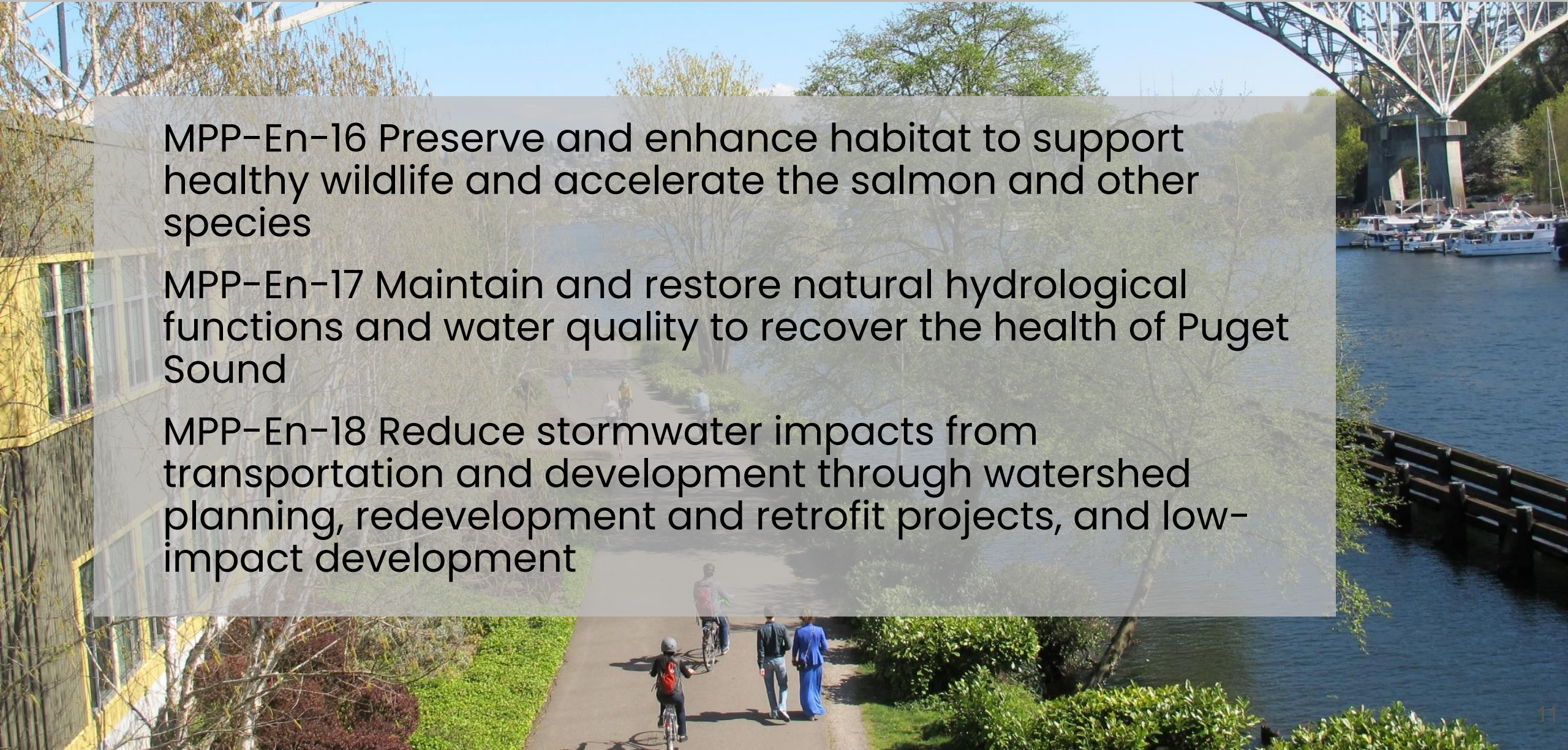
# VISION 2050 and Puget Sound Recovery



MPP-En-16 Preserve and enhance habitat to support healthy wildlife and accelerate the salmon and other species

MPP-En-17 Maintain and restore natural hydrological functions and water quality to recover the health of Puget Sound

MPP-En-18 Reduce stormwater impacts from transportation and development through watershed planning, redevelopment and retrofit projects, and low-impact development
