MOD Work Program

Task 1: Define terminology related to Mobility On Demand (MOD).

- Review and define terms to be clear and consistent
- Review and distinguish similar terms.
- Assess where related/overlapping terms fit/do not fit (e.g. demand response transit, specialized transportation, taxi, etc.).

Task 2: Define the scope of the MOD inventory and develop methodologies to collect data.

MOD Work Program

Task 3: Develop data collection instrument and collect data.

- Depending on the scope (as determined in Task 2), create the survey instrument, develop detailed questions, and collect data.

Task 4: Process and analyze data.

- Once the data is received, PSRC will analyze it in a way that will highlight mobility trends, needs, and potential investment opportunities.

Type	Alternative Terms	Definition	Potential Measures	Local Examples
Micromobility	Bikeshare, scooter share	Small, low-speed vehicles, primarily used for single-person short trips in urban areas with good connectivity and a density of destinations. It serves as a first- and last-mile option that is faster than hailing a taxi, walking, or transferring to low-frequency transit.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Avg. ridership• Avg. deployment• Active membership• % Trips in Equity Focus Area• % Reduced fare trips• Cost• Customer rating	Bird, Lime, Veo, Superpedestrian
