About the Regional TOD Committee

- Continues the work in VISION 2050 **to support equitable transit-oriented development** (TOD) and 65% of future population growth in proximity to transit
- Works with PSRC staff on **VISION 2050 implementation efforts**
- Seeks to **engage, educate, and mobilize** stakeholders to advance transit-oriented development
- **Advises the Growth Management Policy Board**, meets quarterly
- Originally launched in 2014 and rechartered in 2021


