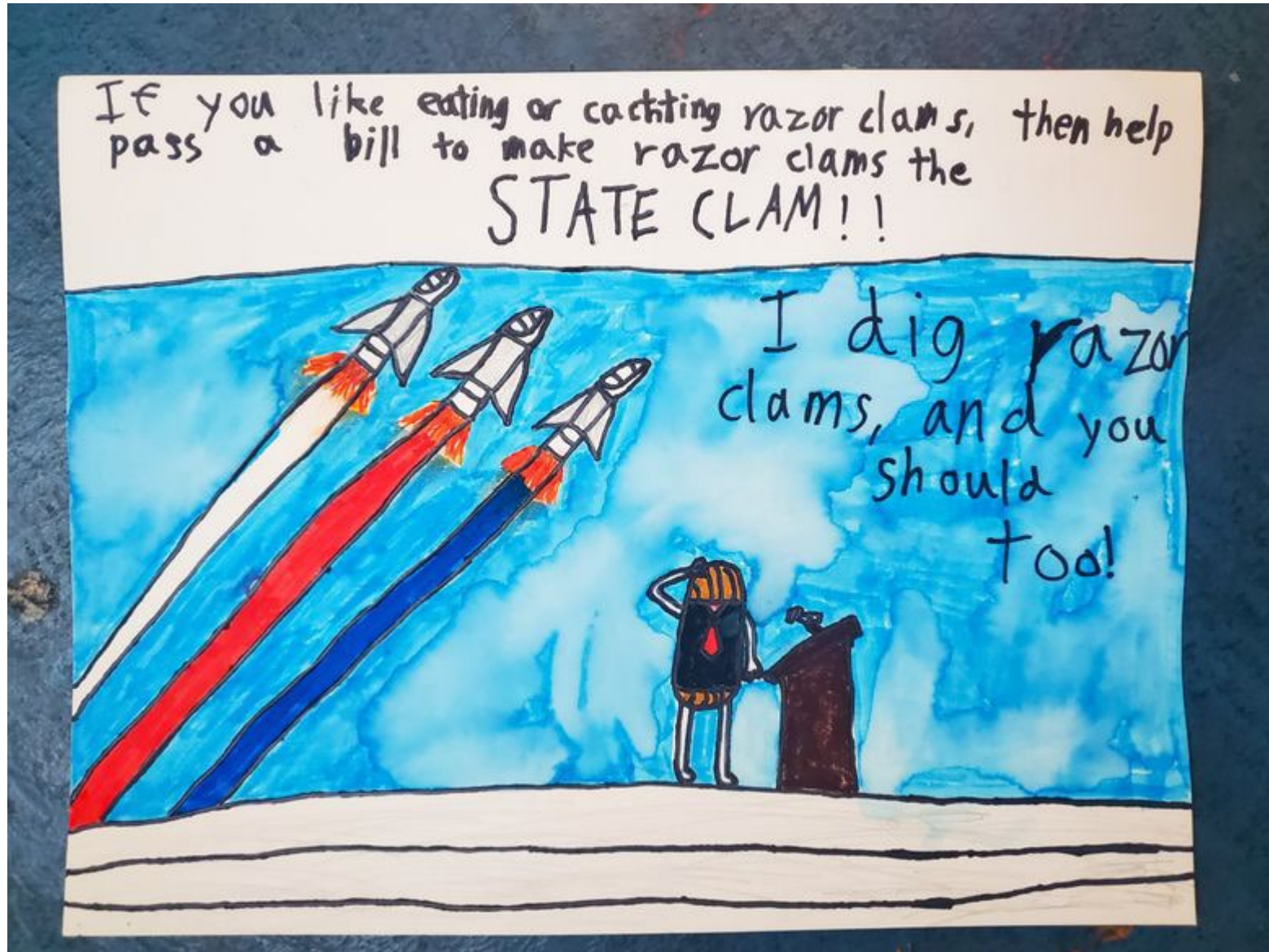

HB 1984

Designating the Pacific razor clam as the state clam (McEntire) dead



Capital Budgets

Senate

- \$650m Climate Commitment Act
- \$112m Housing Trust Fund
\$7.5 other housing
Total \$119m
- \$114m Behavioral Health

House

- \$670m Climate Commitment Act
- \$144.5m Housing Trust Fund
\$8 other housing
Total \$161m
- \$150m Behavioral Health
\$84m Community Capacity Grants



Transportation Budget Considerations

- Revenue decreases
- Cost increases
- Workforce Shortages
- Ballot Measures
- Fish Culvert Replacement



Transportation Budgets

- Safety
- Preservation
- Support, phase or delay mega projects
 - Portage Bay – House cancels bid, Senate provides funds for additional costs
- Ferries
- House \$50k per-mile fee program



Washington State Ferries – Budget

House

- Workforce Development
- Passenger Only Routes – Bremerton and Vashon
- No new preservation \$, directs plan & fund in 2025
- Funds 5 new vessels and 3 conversions
- \$300k work group
- \$20k economic impact study

Senate

- Workforce Development
- Passenger Only Routes – Bremerton and Vashon
- \$30m new preservation funds included
- + \$307m for 5 new vessels and 3 conversions, and commits \$237m CCA funds
- \$140k economic impact study



Washington State Ferries

[HB 2497](#) **WA State Ferries 75 Work Group (Nance)** **dead**

- Work group to evaluate funding requirements, explore options to increase dedicated funding, and optimize the receipt of federal funds
- Study of the economic impact of reduced ferry service

Housing Stability

HB 2114 (Alvarado)/ **SB 5961**

(Trudeau) **dead**

Improving housing stability for tenants

- Limits rent increases to 7% in any 12-month period for buildings > 10 yrs old
- Requires 180 days notice of rent increase > 3%
- Limits move-in fees and security deposit may not exceed one month rent



Housing: Subsidy



HB 2276 (Berg)/ SB 6191 Frame Real Estate Transfer Tax

- Increases Real Estate Transfer Tax (RETT) ceiling for the 1.1% Tier from \$525K to \$750K
- Imposes new RETT of 1% on sales over \$3.025m
- Directs revenue to affordable housing

Co-living Housing

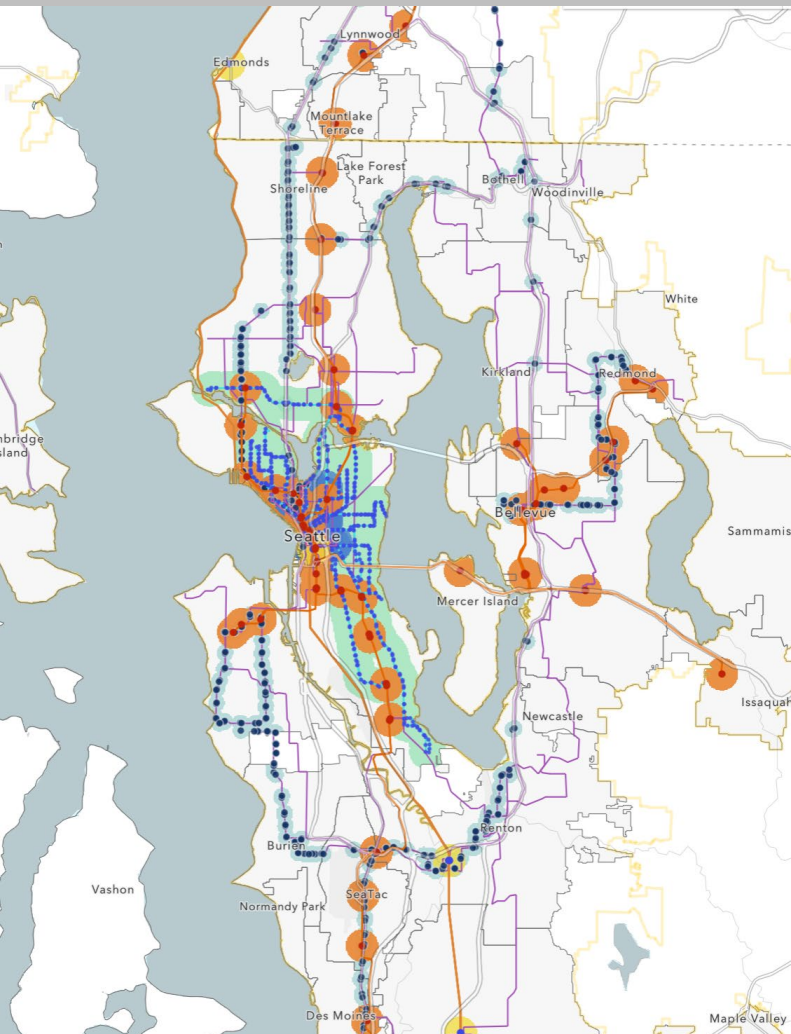
Requires cities and counties to
allow co-living housing in multi-
family zones

[HB 1245](#) (Barkis) **dead** / [SB](#)
[5364](#) (Frame) **dead** Lot
Splitting

Allows lots zoned single family
of 1,500 sq ft or more to be split



Transit Oriented Development



HB 2160 (Reed) / SB 6024 dead
(Trudeau)

Promoting community and transit-oriented housing development

- 3.5 FAR ½ mile of light, commuter or other rail
- 2.5 FAR ¼ mile of BRT
- Allows substantially similar compliance
- 10% affordable housing requirement
- Allows delay in areas at risk of displacement
