#### **IN BRIEF**

The Bylaws of the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District give the board President authority to make appointments to the board to ensure adequate representation and diversity in the makeup of the board.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

Ratify the slate of presidential appointments for the 2024-2026 term.

#### DISCUSSION

The bylaws of the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District specify the makeup of a Board of Directors, including seats for regional cities, counties, ports, tribes, the Washington State Department of Commerce, county Economic Development Councils/Economic Development Boards, Workforce Development Councils and a regional or local Chamber of Commerce.

In addition, the EDD board President has the discretion to make nominations to the board to ensure adequate representation in the makeup of the board. The Bylaws of the Economic Development District state, "All appointments shall conform to the following criteria: non-governmental Directors shall be selected so as to create a diverse board; meet Economic Development Administration requirements, including representation of business, labor, women, people with disabilities and racial minorities; and include representation of the region's cluster industries, research institutions and institutions of higher education."

The incoming president will be asking for the board to ratify a slate of board appointments at the March 6, 2024 meeting, serving a two-year term completing at the EDD's annual meeting in March 2026.

The Central Puget Sound Economic Development District Bylaws state "The Executive Committee, to the extent provided in these Bylaws, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the affairs of the Corporation between regular meetings of the Board; provided, that such committee shall not have the authority of the Board of Directors in reference to altering, amending, or repealing the Bylaws; or, amending or repealing any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its terms provides that it shall not be amended, altered or repealed by such committee. The Committee shall be appointed by the President with ratification by the Board." The Executive Committee shall serve a one-year term, completing at the EDD's annual meeting in March 2025.

**Subject:** State Legislative Update

#### **IN BRIEF**

PSRC is continuing to track the work of the Washington State Legislature related to PSRC priorities. Director of Government Relations and Communications, Robin Koskey, will brief the board on bills regarding housing, transportation, and other topics.

#### DISCUSSION

On January 8, the Washington State Legislature kicked off its short 60-day legislative session. Legislators will pass a supplemental budget and key issues are expected to include behavioral health, addressing the opioid crisis, housing supply, affordability and homelessness, the transportation budget and ferries and climate change. Over 800 bills were pre-filed in advance of the session.

**Subject: Regional Workforce Development Efforts** 

#### **IN BRIEF**

The central Puget Sound region's Local Workforce Development Boards will provide an update on statewide and regional workforce development initiatives, including recent investments in the Economic Security for All initiative.

#### DISCUSSION

Local Workforce Development Boards (LWDB) are business-led boards that coordinate and leverage workforce investments and strategies with stakeholders from education, economic development, labor and community-based organizations to advance the economic health of their respective communities through a skilled and competitive workforce. The central Puget Sound region is served by four LWDBs: Seattle-King County WDC serving King County, Future Workforce Alliance serving Snohomish County, WorkForce Central serving Pierce County and Olympic Consortium WDC serving Kitsap, Clallam, and Jefferson counties.

Economic Security for All (EcSA) is an initiative for building and testing locally developed approaches for streamlining access to existing services and benefits, helping more low-income families move out of poverty. In 2019, the Governor Inslee's office awarded \$5.9 million in federal WIOA funds through EcSA to implement and test four locally developed pilot models to comprehensively address poverty in target communities. Awards were made to local Workforce Development Boards (LWDB) to coordinate local agencies and providers, including WIOA funds and locally identified leveraged resources, to streamline access to benefits and services. The first round of EcSA funding resulted in awards to Spokane, the South Kelso and Highlands

neighborhoods in Cowlitz County, the Salishan/Eastside Tacoma communities in Pierce County, and the city of Connell in Franklin County. These four communities are building comprehensive poverty reduction models that will help 895 families (around 2,700 people) move permanently out of poverty over the next 2.5 years.

At the March meeting, representatives from the central Puget Sound region's LWDB's will present current statewide and regional workforce development initiatives.

**Subject: Greater Seattle Partners** 

#### **IN BRIEF**

Greater Seattle Partners (GSP), a regional public-private economic development organization focused on global business attraction, site selection and promoting investment and trade opportunities in the region, will provide an update on recent work and planned efforts for 2024.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Greater Seattle Partners (GSP) is a public-private partnership that leads regional economic development through global business attraction, site selection and investment and trade opportunities in the Greater Seattle region. GSP collaborates with community and economic development partners to ensure that every person in the central Puget Sound region has the opportunity to prosper. GSP strives to attract and retain quality family/living wage jobs across all communities in the region. Throughout the world GSP tells the story of the region's talent, pioneering spirit, unique communities, and quality of life.

GSP's work is centered on three pillars:

- JOBS: Engage the world to attract global investment and advance trade.
- TALENT: Grow our talent to strengthen our regional competitiveness.
- COMMUNITY: Elevate regional economic collaboration to ensure regionwide economic development performance.

GSP helps local companies looking for information about the region, and outside companies or institutions considering Greater Seattle for a new location. The organization serves as a resource for sophisticated data analytics and research that

showcases the region, supports promotion and recruitment initiatives and summarizes current economic trends. This includes key indicators such as labor market data, foreign direct investment, global trade and gross regional product as benchmarks.

GSP attracts national and international companies and investment to support job growth in the region, utilizing evidence-based research to understand target investment opportunities and support companies and site selectors. The organization coordinates and hosts inbound international business delegations and creates high-value programs that ensure productive visits. GSP forges international business connections through targeted outbound missions. These trips provide opportunities for diverse groups of regional leaders and representatives to strategically promote and grow the Greater Seattle region.

At the March board meeting, Brian Surratt, President & Chief Executive Officer, and Rebecca Lovell, Chief Operating Officer, will provide an overview of GSP's recent efforts and focus areas for 2024.

Subject: PSRC Staff Report

#### **2024 Economic Development Priorities**

In November, the Economic Development District board established <u>priorities</u> for board meetings and staff efforts in 2024. This includes strengthening the state's economic development and workforce development ecosystems, and investing in infrastructure, broadband and technologies such as clean energy and artificial intelligence. Some of these priorities are aimed to capitalize on the influx of federal funding to the region, including the major hydrogen hub designation contracted with the Pacific Northwest Hydrogen Association.

#### **Industrial Lands Analysis Update**

PSRC is developing an update to the <u>Regional Industrial Lands Analysis</u>, last performed in 2015. At the November EDD Board meeting, PSRC staff provided an <u>update of the Industrial Lands Analysis update project</u>. Throughout the end of 2023 staff performed additional outreach to PSRC boards and committees and regional stakeholders in preparation for development of the draft report, which will be available in Spring 2024.

#### Transit Agency Workforce Analysis

In the fall of 2023, PSRC organized a discussion with regional transit agencies regarding workforce challenges related to greater adoption of zero emission transit vehicles. The discussion included representatives from Sound Transit, Washington State Ferries, King County Metro, Community Transit, Everett Transit, Pierce Transit and Kitsap Transit. At this meeting, PSRC heard that more data and information was needed to quantify the collective workforce challenge at the agencies. Through the end of February, PSRC has been working with each of the transit agencies to detail challenges being faced and to aggregate workforce data. summarizing the work completed then and requesting time to meet with each of the transit agencies. PSRC staff are in the process of documenting findings and determining next steps.

#### **Ferry Communities Leadership Convening**

On January 19<sup>th</sup>, PSRC convened local, regional, and state leaders to discuss their experiences with the region's ferry system and ideas for improvement. At the meeting, Washington State Ferry staff gave a <u>presentation</u> to update attendees on the state of the ferry system. Representative Greg Nance then discussed proposals to restore the state's ferry system and mitigate potential future impact. After the meeting, PSRC worked with attendees to sign a letter of support for robust investments in Washington State Ferries to restore full ferry system service. On February 23<sup>rd</sup>, PSRC convened local elected leaders to discuss the state's transportation budget. PSRC plans to continue convening local elected officials to push for ferry service restoration.

#### **Regional Centers Data Profiles**

PSRC released new Regional Centers Profiles to provide data and information on the region's designated centers. This online dashboard includes unique pages for each center with interactive data graphs and charts. The profiles include the region's 30 regional growth centers, which have the most significant business, governmental, and cultural facilities and are planning for growth, as well as the region's 10 manufacturing/industrial centers which are locations for more intensive industrial activity.

#### Comprehensive Plans are due in 2024

Regional cities and counties need to update their Comprehensive Plans by the end of 2024. PSRC has developed a set of tools and resources to assist local planners in their development of these plans, including an <a href="mailto:Economic Development Element Guide">Economic Development Element Guide</a>. Subject: Draft Supplemental Biennial Budget and Work Program (FY2024-2025)

#### **IN BRIEF**

At its March meeting, the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District Board will be given information on PSRC's Draft Supplemental Biennial Budget and Work Program FY2024-2025 and its Economic Development District (Task 300) element in preparation for adoption of the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District's budget at its June 5 meeting.

#### DISCUSSION

The Central Puget Sound Economic Development District (EDD) is a nonprofit corporation in the State of Washington. The EDD has a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Puget Sound Regional Council under which the two agencies have consolidated staff services to increase government efficiency and further integrate the EDD's economic development work with the regional growth management and transportation planning programs at PSRC. Through the MOA, PSRC provides contract services to support the EDD's work program.

The Puget Sound Regional Council operates under a two-year (biennial) budget and work program. The Economic Development District (Task 300) element of PSRC's biennial budget serves as the basis for the budget for the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District. The EDD Board is required in its bylaws to take action to adopt its budget.

PSRC's overall budget and work program supports regional objectives, local government priorities and legal mandates associated with PSRC's responsibilities as

the federal Metropolitan Planning Organization, state Regional Transportation Planning Organization, as well as facilitator of the region's Economic Development District. The work program covers regional transportation, growth, and economic development planning, and technical, data, and administrative services.

In November 2023, the EDD Board met to establish <u>Economic Development Priorities</u> <u>for 2024</u>, which are used as a work plan to guide board and staff efforts to implement the Regional Economic Strategy over the upcoming year. Base funding for the EDD's work program is provided through a Partnership Planning Program grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration. The grant provides the EDD with \$200,000 over each biennium, with a required \$200,000 local match.

Projects that are identified through core economic development planning activities frequently require additional funding to implement. Funding sources for these projects can include other PSRC funds, contributions from regional partners or grants from the EDA or other sources. Implementation of the annual Economic Development Priorities is also supported through elements of PSRC's budget outside of the Economic Development District (Task 300) element. This includes the Regional Planning (Task 000) element, which supports agency wide departmental administration, special projects, and other support tasks. It also includes the Council Support (Task 500) element which supports agency-wide communications as well as EDD board management assistance.

In May 2023, PSRC's General Assembly adopted the agency's Fiscal Years 2024-2025 Biennial Budget and Work Program which covers the period from July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2025. The draft supplemental budget reflects revenues and expenditure of \$44,837,000, including approximately \$9.8 million in increased carryover grants from the previous biennium that have been added since adoption in May 2023. The Economic Development District (Task 300) portion of the draft biennial budget includes revenues and expenditures of \$501,000. Revenues for this budget task consist of \$200,000 from the EDA Partnership Planning Program grant, as well as \$301,000 in EDD dues collected from PSRC's membership to support the district's work. There are no proposed changes in revenues or expenditures to the Economic Development District (Task 300) portion of the budget.

#### Budget Development Timeline

- Late 2023: PSRC staff develops the draft Supplemental Biennial Budget and Work Program (FY2024-2025) in partnership with PSRC's Operations Committee.
- November 2023: EDD Board meets to develop the 2024 Economic Development Priorities, laying out its work for the current year.

- January 2024 March 2024: The draft supplemental budget is shared with the Executive Board, Economic Development District Board, Growth Management Policy Board, Transportation Policy Board and the Regional Staff Committee. The Economic Development District Board is invited to provide comments to the Operations Committee by March 15, 2024.
- April 2024: The Operations Committee will consider comments and recommended approval of the budget by PSRC's Executive Board. The Executive Board will recommend the budget for adoption by the General Assembly.
- May 30, 2024: PSRC's General Assembly will meet to adopt the Draft Supplemental Biennial Budget and Work Program (FY2024-2025).
- June 5, 2024: EDD Board will meet to adopt the Economic Development District element (Task 300) of PSRC's Draft Supplemental Biennial Budget and Work Program (FY2024-2025) as the budget for the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District.

# **Economic Development District (Task 300)**

## **Objective**

Provide staff support to the Economic Development District (EDD) Board of Directors. Maintain the central Puget Sound region's eligibility for economic development planning and technical assistance funding from the federal Economic Development Administration. Develop, update, and assist in implementation of the Regional Economic Strategy, which serves as the region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). Under direction from the EDD Board of Directors, coordinate with public, private, and community stakeholders to develop and implement initiatives that strengthen the region's economy.

#### **Sub-Tasks**

#### Sub-Task 1. EDD General

Ongoing administrative, managerial, and operational efforts are required to maintain status as the Central Puget Sound Economic Development District (EDD), including:

- a. Convene and provide staff support to the EDD Board of Directors, subcommittees, and other working groups or taskforces.
- b. Annually update the Regional Economic Strategy.
- c. Develop and maintain tracking tools, performance measure data and other products to facilitate strategy implementation.
- d. Coordinate events and programs, as appropriate, to aid in implementation of the Regional Economic Strategy.
- e. Prepare budget and work program.
- f. Review and evaluate employee performance.
- g. Develop, apply for, and monitor grants and contracts in support of the Regional Economic Strategy.

#### **Sub-Task 2. Regional Economic Strategy Implementation**

The Regional Economic Strategy, adopted in December 2022, is the guiding document for key regional economic initiatives. The EDD Board will maintain a work plan of initiatives to implement the strategy, informed by ongoing evaluation. Economic development staff will work with regional partners to implement these initiatives, including:

- a. Identify emerging industry opportunities, subsectors, or cross-cluster opportunities;
- b. Identify challenges and opportunities faced by the region's economy;
- c. Perform and coordinate qualitative and quantitative analysis to help detail the region's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats and develop targeted strategies to improve the region's competitive position:
- d. Develop, run, and collaborate on events that bring together economic development interests in the region and highlight regional priorities.

- 1. Annual Economic Development Work Plan Developed and Adopted (2023 and 2024)
- 2. EDA Planning Grant Secured (June 2023)

#### **Mandates**

This work element provides for program development, administration and management of regional economic development planning activities as required by:

- 1. **EDD/PSRC Memorandum of Agreement** dated June 27, 2002.
- 2. Authority for the CPSEDD creation is by a **Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement** between the counties of King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish dated May 5, 1971 and amended November 13, 2003.
- 3. Federal authority for the creation, recognition and funding of multi-jurisdictional economic development districts is found in the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-136, 42 U.S.C. 3121 et sec.) as amended, including the comprehensive amendments by the Economic Development Administration Reform Act of 1998 (Public Law 105-393) and the Economic Development Administration Reauthorization Act of 2004 (Public Law 108-373). Criteria for district program functions and funding are found in 13 CFR Part 301 (area eligibility), 302 (district designation), 303 (district planning process) and 306 (planning assistance).
