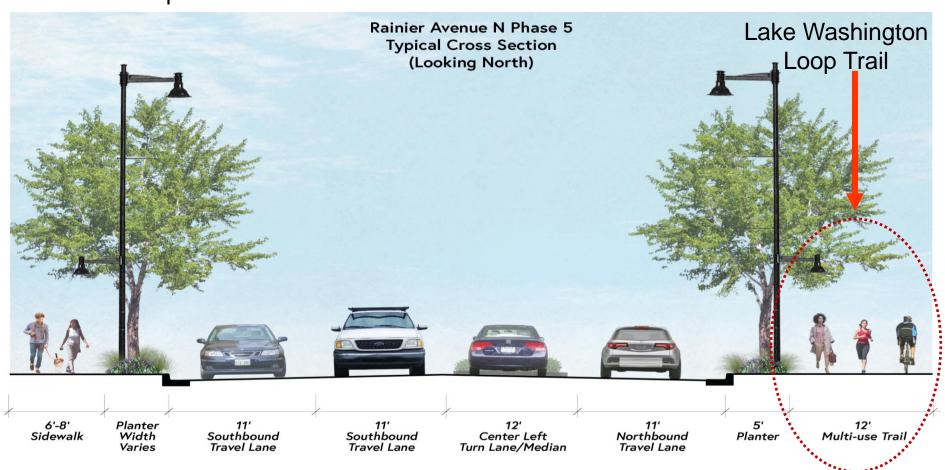


5-Lane roadway has excess capacity in northbound direction

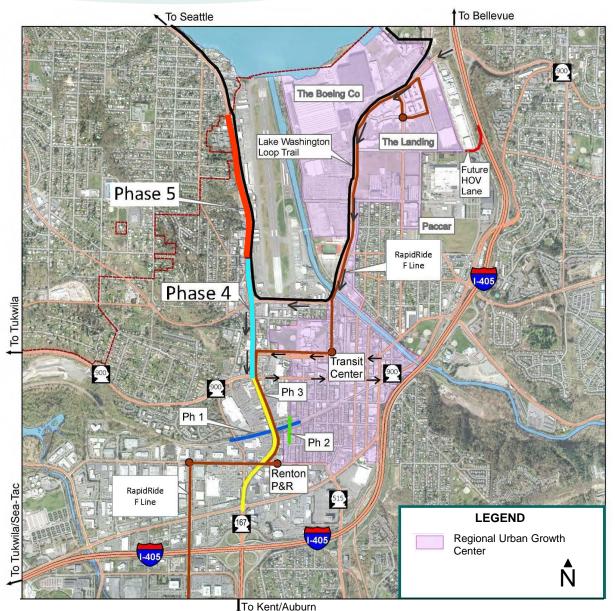

- Key multimodal corridor connecting Seattle, surrounding neighborhoods, and Regional Growth Center.
- Regional Growth Center supports 50,000 existing jobs.
- 17,000 new housing units and 31,780 new jobs planned by 2044.

COMPLETES RAINIER AVENUE CORRIDOR

Final phase of the Rainier Ave Corridor
Improvements (\$80M in investments) –
critical route to Seattle, Downtown Renton,
Boeing, The Landing, SouthPort, I-405, and
SR 167.

COMPLETES GAP IN LAKE WASHINGTON TRAIL SYSTEM

Connects between existing non-motorized facilities in Seattle and Lake Washington Loop Trail/other regional trails.

IMPROVES MULTIMODAL TRAVEL OPTIONS

Provides safe non-motorized alternatives and access to transit service, including the new South RentonTransit Center and future BRT + RapidRide lines.

HOUSING NEEDS



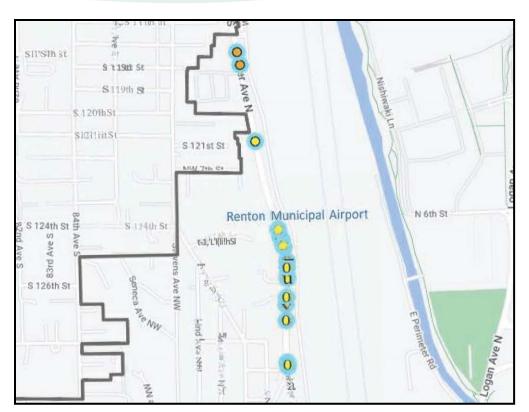
Various Outreach Conducted:

- Bike and Trails Master Plan
- Comprehensive Plan

Displacement:

- Project is in area of "Higher Displacement Risk" (source: PSRC Displacement Risk Map)
- City has adopted Housing Action Plan (HAP) that serves as the short-term strategy for increasing housing options/affordability in the community.
- Response from community engagement emphasized residents desire for housing correlates to desire to be near services, transportation options, and other community amenities.

Safety



Crash Counts (2018 to present)

- 23 crashes
- 15 injuries (2 severe)
- 1 pedestrian involved
- 1 bicycle involved

Both severe injury crashes were pedestrian and bike related.

- Improves non-motorized safety with pedestrian lighting, and wider sidewalks and multi-use trail that are separated from vehicle lanes.
- Improves vehicle safety with access management to reduce potential conflict points.



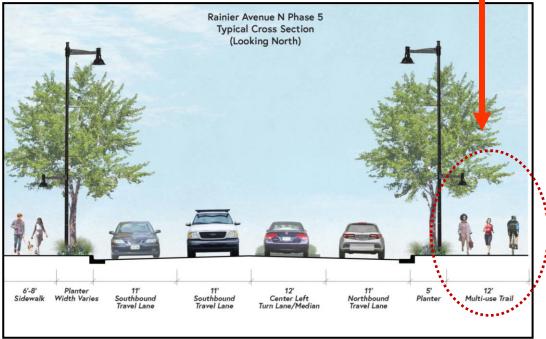
Air Quality/Climate Change
