Discussion: PSRC Transportation Committee Assessment

Gil Cerise, PSRC, provided an overview of PSRC's ongoing assessment of its eight current transportation committees for efficiencies and to maximize regionwide engagement opportunities, as further detailed in the accompanying memo. This included key findings on how each committee advances regional transportation work program goals and objectives, and how PSRC can best engage stakeholders for each committee topic area.

Sarah then presented planned updates to the committee purpose statement and associated work program to more clearly communicate how the BPAC advances PSRC's active transportation work program. The updated purpose statement and work program will provide the basis for the revised committee operating procedures document that PSRC will share at the May BPAC meeting.
