

Why we monitor the housing landscape

The <u>Regional Housing Strategy</u> is a playbook of regional and local actions to preserve, improve and expand the region's housing stock to <u>meet the</u> needs of all residents

The strategy calls for PSRC to track housing performance and outcomes over time, and identify challenges or barriers in consultation with jurisdictions and other stakeholders



Homeownership Rates by Race & Ethnicity


Asians have among the highest homeownership rates across major race categories; Pacific Islanders have the lowest





Homeownership Rates by AAPI Group


There is wide variation in homeownership rates across AAPI groups






Mortgage Loan Denial Rates by Race & Ethnicity

Renter Cost Burden




What is renter cost burden?

A renter household is considered cost burdened if they spend 30% or more of their income on rent.


Renter Cost Burden by Race & Ethnicity

Some AAPI groups are cost burdened at substantially higher rates




Renter Household Income & Occupation

Important Takeaways


The AAPI community is not a monolith, there are wide variations in incomes, renter cost burden and homeownership rates across AAPI groups
