Subject: Regional Safety Plan Update on Engagement

IN BRIEF

PSRC staff are working with consultant partners Uncommon Bridges to create and execute an engagement strategy for the Regional Safety Action Plan, which is being developed through funding awarded by the USDOT Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program. The Regional Staff Committee will be briefed on the engagement plan and work to date and will have an opportunity to provide feedback.

BOARD CALENDAR

This item will summarize public engagement efforts for the Regional Safety Action Plan that have begun and will continue steadily throughout the summer and fall. Staff will present an early engagement summary at the September Transportation Policy Board and Executive Board meetings.

DISCUSSION

The 2022 Regional Transportation Plan directs PSRC to develop a Regional Safety Plan, including actions, targets, and performance indicators. It also directs PSRC to seek resources for regional and local planning and projects and, going forward, to use the Regional Safety Plan to help inform future regional and local planning.

The Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) adopted in 2021 established the new SS4A discretionary program with \$5 billion in appropriated funds over five years. In 2022, PSRC, in coordination with the Cities of Burien, Everett, Kent, Redmond, Tukwila, and Pierce County applied for and in February 2023 was awarded \$4.9 million for safety planning.

PSRC is using its portion of grant funding to develop a Regional Safety Plan. Because of the size, scope, and funding timeline for this work, PSRC has contracted two consultant teams to assist with the completion of the Regional Safety Plan. One consultant team, led by WSP, will be working on the technical aspects of the Regional Safety Plan such as data analysis and policy research. The second consultant team, led by Uncommon Bridges, will focus on equitable engagement for the project. The two consultant teams are working closely together alongside PSRC staff for the duration of the project.

PSRC staff and consultant partners have created an engagement plan to share with the Regional Staff Committee.

Subject: Puget Sound Regional Data Trends

IN BRIEF

At the July 18 Regional Staff Committee meeting, PSRC staff will provide a background presentation on the latest Trends in the Puget Sound region.

This item will provide an overview of selected regional growth, environmental, and transportation trends and updated data resources available to members and the public. The topic is tentatively scheduled for the September Executive Board meeting.

DISCUSSION

As part of the long-range performance-based planning process, PSRC is involved in an ongoing effort to track a variety of regional demographic and transportation trends across the region. This presentation will look at several trends that highlight how our region continues to change post-pandemic. Some of the data includes the latest population growth from the Office of Financial Management, changes in jobs and unemployment within the region along with changes in vehicle and transit usage.

Subject: Title VI Demographic Profile

IN BRIEF

At its meeting on July 18, 2024, the Regional Staff Committee will hear about PSRC's work to conduct a triannual update to its Title VI demographic profile, a component of the agency's broader Title VI Plan.

BOARD CALENDAR

This agenda item will provide information about an upcoming update to the region's Demographic Profile, along with planned enhancements and refinements to the data. The topic is not scheduled for Board briefings, discussion, or action.

DISCUSSION

As part of its Title VI requirements, PSRC develops and maintains a <u>Title VI Plan</u> which includes a demographic profile of the central Puget Sound region's people of color, low-income, and other demographic populations relevant to supporting the agency's equity work program as well as public outreach and engagement activities. The profile is updated every three years, with the last update occurring in 2021.

The Committee will hear about the role and purpose served by the Title VI demographic profile in metropolitan planning organization (MPO) activities, and the federal statutory and administrative framework that governs this planning requirement.

The presentation will also include an overview of the agency's <u>2021 Central Puget</u> <u>Sound Demographic Profile</u>, including key data highlights, as well as the scope of work for the 2024 update to the profile.

NEXT STEPS

PSRC is working collaboratively with a subcommittee of the Equity Advisory Committee (EAC) to finalize the 2024 demographic profile for submission to our federal funding partners in October. We will also be working with the EAC and EAC subcommittee to develop an interactive Storymap report to highlight key findings from the demographic profile to share with the broader public.
