

STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ECOSYSTEM

WEDA believes a robust economic development ecosystem at the state, regional and local levels is crucial for sustained economic vitality, resilience & job growth.

2023-24 LEGISLATIVE RESULTS:

Support state-level leadership and funding for economic development, including Business Recruitment, Retention & Expansion programs

2023-24 Results: Maintenance level preserved, with a few increases including PTAC \$2.2M and ScaleUp \$450K; \$1M for SBDC and \$3M WSMA now *ongoing*

Increase funding for regional capacity to coordinate and deliver economic development services.

Ongoing \$5 million (annual) "ADO Innovation, Sustainability, Partnerships & Equity Fund" supported by Commerce, proposed to Governor & Legislature

2023-24 Results: 2019/2021 \$2M restoration protected; 2023 - HB 1717 ADO Innovation bill died in Senate Ways & Means then 2024 - \$696K in new funding passed (need to fix large urban county cap); 2023 - HB 1783 \$1.4M for ADO Grant Writers signed into law, program underway.

STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ECOSYSTEM

Associate Development Organizations/Economic Development Councils

- Governor Booth Gardner created "Team Washington" network in 1985 – still high-performing 40 years later
- 35 regional economic development organizations serve all 39 counties; each region has unique economic needs, approach
- "Ground game" for Washington State Commerce department; underpin the State's economic development programs and initiatives
- Enhance economic development service delivery and results statewide through public-private, state-local partnerships
- Mission: confidential, client-based economic development that public-private partnerships are uniquely equipped to provide
- Critical role as conveners & catalysts



STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ECOSYSTEM

Associate Development Organizations/Economic Development Councils

<u>COLLECTIVE RESULTS</u> (measured and reported quarterly to Commerce):

- Over the last five years, local ADO/EDCs have helped over 627 businesses expand or develop new facilities and assisted 1,112 start ups.
- These companies have invested over \$10.2 billion in land, buildings and equipment.
- These growing businesses have created over **20,444 new** jobs and retained over **21,532** jobs.
- EDC business clients generate over **\$100 million** in new tax revenues for Washington State and local communities annually. Every state dollar leverages a match of at least six dollars from other public and private sources.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION & NEEDS:

- New responsibilities including equity and increased accountability yet no Cost-of-Living, inflation or annual population adjustments
- **Goal:** Support & align with state and regional initiatives underway to foster improved workforce development, innovation, sustainability, partnerships & collaboration for results-driven inclusive economic development.



STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ECOSYSTEM

2025 REQUEST: \$5 million/year for Innovation, Sustainability, Partnerships & Equity Initiatives, including raising of funding "floor" & "cap"

- **Goal:** Recover and grow jobs, retain and expand existing firms, recruit new business, support key industry clusters and support an equitable economy and inclusive economic development
- \$3M proposed by Commerce Department and under Governor/OFM consideration in 2025-27 Operating Budget decision package
- Ongoing \$5M (annual) in new funding, a formulaic "plus up" of state funding (ADOs now receive \$10M per biennium, with \$85K floor and \$300K cap restored to Great Recession levels after multiple reductions; proposal to raise floor to \$150K and cap to \$500K with \$5M in new funding)
- Would support and align with multiple state and regional initiatives underway and emerging to foster improved workforce development, innovation, sustainability and regional partnerships and collaboration for results-driven, inclusive economic development.



FOSTER CATALYSTS FOR JOB GROWTH & ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

WEDA supports investments in infrastructure and programs – as well as matching funds – that catalyze business retention, expansion, recruitment and resiliency at the regional and local levels.

2023-24 LEGISLATIVE RESULTS & 2025 PRIORITIES

- Protect the TIF for Jobs tool (2021) now being employed/explored by over 25 jurisdictions 2023

 Result: HB 1527 "TIF Fix" bill passed 2024 Result: protected
- Support <u>site readiness programs</u>, and the creation of a <u>site certification program</u>
- Support broadband & clean energy capacity initiatives, investment & permitting
- Support state <u>Tourism</u> investments & catalytic opportunities through <u>World Cup & FIFA26</u>
- More state matching funds to improve WA's competitiveness & attract out-of-state investment 2024 Result: HB 1870, "Moving Assets To Community Health (MATCH) Act" passed, \$500K in funding
- Support Catalytic <u>Innovation & Investment Programs</u>: pursuit of exports & "Go Global" website; disaster programs for small businesses, resources for microenterprises & entrepreneurs
- Invest in infrastructure through state public works programs which support expanding businesses (CERB core funding, Public Works, Transportation Improvement Board)
- Support increased investments in road, rail and transit infrastructure, maintenance and services to more efficiently move people and freight
- Protect Economic Development Strategic Reserve Fund 2023-24 Results: \$8.5M funding level
- Protect targeted incentives to **foster innovation clusters** and private investment

INCREASE ECONOMIC VITALITY FOR <u>ALL</u> OF WA

WEDA supports policies and investments that ensure that all parts of the state, and all people, benefit in economic growth through inclusive economic development. The economic vitality of rural and underserved urban areas is critical to the long-term health of the entire state.

2023-24 LEGISLATIVE RESULTS & 2025 REQUESTS

■ Protect the .09 percent Sales & Use Tax for Public Facilities and economic development activities in Rural Counties

Rural counties in WA have benefitted from up to a .09% "rebate" of locally-generated state sales & use tax for over 20 years. Tool has helped to build critical infrastructure, attract new industry and diversify economies, and create/retain jobs.

2023 Result: HB 1267 new law -- .09 extended to 2054

■ Protect Diversity, Equity & Inclusion investments (Small Business Resiliency Network, Small Business Online Tools, Equity Development staffing)



ADDITIONAL WEDA PRIORITIES

2023-24 LEGISLATIVE RESULTS & 2025 REQUESTS:

- Workforce Development 2024 Result: EcSa program established in law, needs funding
 - Human capital essential for business innovation, growth and competitiveness
 - Support Washington's 12 Local Workforce Development Boards which leverage public and private resources to meet talent pipeline needs with innovative, data-driven solutions
 - Other important workforce programs include Job Skills Program, Customized Training, Apprenticeships, One-Stop WorkSource Centers, work-based learning & reskilling
 - Preservation & needed growth of state funding for post-secondary/higher education
 - Strong K-12 system and early learning -- must address severe childcare capacity gaps
- Housing Affordability & Supply: WEDA will support legislation to improve housing affordability and expand opportunities for housing at all income levels, particularly workforce and attainable housing. 2023 Results: \$1B, HB 1110+ passed
- Clean/Green Economy: WEDA supports programs, funding and incentives to create jobs in the Clean Economy, while also maintaining a balanced approach.
- **Rulemaking**: WEDA supports permit streamlining/efficiency initiatives that increase predictability in development.
