Coordinated Mobility and Accessibility Committee Meeting Summary

Welcome and Introductions

Jean Kim, PSRC, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. and took a roll call of the membership in attendance.

Approval of Meeting Summary

The December 10, 2024 meeting summary was approved as presented.

Discussion: Regional Safety Action Plan Release for Public Comment

Gary Simonson, PSRC, presented the draft Regional Safety Action Plan (RSAP) to the committee, outlining key elements of each chapter. The plan includes: the problem statement and call to action; key findings based on crash data analysis, including regional emphasis areas, crash types, and contributing factors; RSAP public engagement and outreach; strategies organized by different types; and implementation and next steps. The draft RSAP is open for public comment until February 14, 2025.

Discussion: Key Demographic Trends and Messages for Coordinated Mobility Plan

Jean Kim, PSRC, presented findings from the 2024 Regional Coordinated Mobility Plan Survey and additional data collection. She highlighted demographic trends among individuals with mobility and accessibility needs, as well as key insights from the 2023 Regional Household Travel Survey, which help explain the travel behaviors of priority populations. Jean also reviewed data received from transit and specialized transportation providers, covering ridership, costs, and other findings. The CMAC asked questions and provided feedback. Staff will share updated information in March.

Discussion: Regional Transportation Plan & Coordinated Mobility Plan Engagement

Jean Kim, PSRC, provided an overview of the engagement plan for the Coordinated Mobility Plan, which aims to identify the transportation needs of underserved communities and develop strategies to address them. She outlined the two-phase outreach approach: Phase 1 (March–May), which will focus on identifying the transportation needs of priority populations; and Phase 2 (June–October), when the collaboration with communities and stakeholders is planned to develop prioritized strategies based on the identified needs. PSRC requested the committee's assistance in identifying organizations to support outreach efforts.
