- Operating budget deficit of \$12-\$15 billion
- Transportation budget deficit of \$8 billion, \$1-\$1.8 billion in FY 25-27


Budget Pressures:



Road Usage Charge




- <u>HB 1921</u> (Fey) / <u>SB 5726</u> (Ramos)
- Phased Approach
- 2.6 cents per mile, increased over time linked to fuel tax
- Odometer reporting
- Use restricted to maintenance and preservation protected by the 18th amendment
- 10% road usage assessment to support alternative transportation

Safe System Approach SB 5581 (Shewmake)

Would prioritize active transportation in WSDOT construction projects and programs by integrating shared-use paths, trails, roundabouts and Complete Streets principles.



Transportation Project Delivery

HB 1902 (Richards)
Streamlining Permitting for Transportation Projects

Requires WSDOT, in consultation with Dept. of Ecology, to convene work group to develop recommendations to streamline permitting of transportation projects

SB 5773 (Liias)

Creates Statutory framework for implementation of public private partnerships for transportation projects to reduce costs and deliver projects faster



Passenger Rail

Intercity Passenger Rail HB 1837 (Reed) / SB 5667 dead (Valdez)

- Establishes targets for WSDOT for minimum trip times, roundtrips per day and trip reliability
- 2-3 hours 4520mins travel time
 Seattle /Vancouver, B.C. and 2.5 2
 hours 45mins Seattle to Portland
- Requires WSDOT to provide yearly updates on meeting targets



Housing Supply: Transit-Oriented Development

Promoting Transit Oriented Housing Development


HB 1491 (Reed)

Creates density requirement in station areas

- 3.5 FAR w/in .5m of rail (.25m in cites
 <15,000 people)
- 2.5 FAR w/in .25m of BRT

Authorizes 20-year tax exemption for residential buildings in station area


Requires Commerce to administer grant program to assist cities to implement the TOD requirements



Housing Stability - Rent Stabilization

Rent stabilization <u>HB 1217</u>/ <u>SB 5222</u>

- Limit rent increases to no more than
 7 percent per year
- Require 6 months' notice for a rent increase of 3 percent or more
- Establish fees count as rent for the purposes of calculating an increase
- Limit move-in fees to the equivalent of one month's rent or less
- Limit late fees to no more than 1.5% of the monthly rent



Housing Supply: Parking Requirements



Minimum Parking Requirements
HB 1299 (Peterson) dead / SB 5184
(Bateman)
Prohibits cities and counties from requiring:

- More than 0.5 parking space per residential unit
- More than 1 parking space per 1000 feet of commercial space
- Eliminates minimum parking requirements for several building types including affordable & senior housing and homes < 1200 sq ft
