Climate Pollution Reduction Grant

PSCAA received a grant from the federal Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) program to lead regional climate action planning.

We are currently developing a Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP), due December 1, 2025.

The regional plan includes King, Kitsap, Pierce, and Snohomish counties.





Climate Plan Goals

- Create a long-term regional plan to achieve climate goals
- Align with and complement state and local plans
- Build regional collaborations for collective climate action
- Make our region more competitive for grant applications
- · Align priorities and foster equity across our region



Comprehensive Climate Action Plan Scope

- Summarize baseline data on regional GHG emissions
- Identify targets to reduce GHG emissions
- Create a comprehensive list of actions to meet our targets
- Analyze and prioritize community benefits, especially for disproportionately impacted communities
- Consider workforce development needs to implement the list of actions





Process Goals

- The CPRG process will foster collaboration among regional partners and position the region as a leader in climate action and innovation.
- Regional planning will align with and complement state and local policies and plans
- Identified actions will be developed into funding-ready strategies that are more competitive for future funding opportunities, providing a clear path to implementation
- Collaborative relationships will benefit jurisdictions through leveraging collective resources and aligning priorities

Agency staff are working with a CPRG steering committee and sector-specific working groups to develop the CCAP and to facilitate longer-term regional collaborations to achieve climate goals.



Greenhouse Gas Emissions in Our Region






Emissions Reduction Targets & Projections

PSCAA Targets: Reduce the region's greenhouse gas emissions to **50% below 1990 levels by 2030**, and the region is on a trajectory to achieve the state goal of **95% below 1990 levels by 2050**.

- Region-wide emissions were estimated at 43.8 MMTCO₂e in 1990 and 48 MMTCO₂e in 2019.
- Near-term target is particularly challenging, and more work is needed in the next 5-10 years to ensure we reach the 2050 goal.





Emission Reduction Strategies & Actions


- We are working with PSRC and other partners to develop and quantify a comprehensive list of strategies and actions for all sectors

- We welcome your input on how to make this plan most useful to you.





Winter

• Draft greenhouse gas reduction strategies and actions

Spring

• Engage communities to inform plan development

• Analyze local air quality benefits and workforce needs for identified actions


Summer

- Compile draft Comprehensive Climate Action Plan


Fall
