Adopted in House/Moving in Senate

- School Funding <u>SB 5812</u> / <u>HB 2049</u>
- B&O tax surcharge <u>SB 5815</u> / <u>HB 2081</u>
- Tax on surplus generated by Zero Emission Fuel Program <u>SB 5811</u> / HB 2077

Adopted in Senate & House

- Capital Gains and Estate Taxes <u>SB 5813</u> / <u>HB</u>
 2082
- Taxes on Services & Nicotine Products & Prepayment of Sales Tax <u>SB 5814</u> / <u>HB 2083</u>





Transportation Budget: Revenue SB 5801

- Fuel Tax 6 cent increase in FY 26 and 2% increase each year
- Special Fuel (Diesel)
 3 cent increase in special fuel tax
- Vehicle Registration fees
 Truck weight, Passenger
 vehicle weight, filing, title
 & registration,
 abandoned recreational
 vehicle



Transportation Budget: Revenue SB 5801

Sales and Use Taxes

- Motor vehicle sales and use tax from .3 to .5%,
- Rental car tax 5.9 to 11.9%
- Per to peer car sharing
- Recreational Vessels, Luxury Vehicle, Luxury Aircraft

Other Fees

- Tire disposal
- Large Event Facility
- WSDOT Work Zone Violations
- Driver's License and Identicards
- Remove toll exemption for transit and ride share vehicles

Comparison of Transportation Proposals



Washington State Ferries – SB 5801

- Requires WSF to contract for 5 or more new vessels (was up to 5)
- Changes design size of Olympic vessels from 144 to 160 vehicles
- Raises vessel replacement surcharge:
 - From 25 cents to 75 cents in 2025
 - 85 cents as of 10/2027
 - 95 cents 10/2029
- Requires WSF to recover at least 3% of credit card fees through fare increases



Transportation Revenue

SSB 5802

Transfers .1% sales tax to transportation budget



Transportation Bills



- HB 1902 passed both houses
 Streamlining Permitting for
 Transportation Projects
- HB 1837 passed both houses, concurrence
 Intercity Passenger Rail



Housing Stability

Rent Stabilization

HB 1217 (Alvarado) passed both houses – likely conference SB 5222 dead (Trudeau)

Senate Amended:

- Limit rent increase to 10% plus consumer price index
- Exempts single family homes not owned by corporation



Housing Supply: Transit-Oriented Development

Promoting Transit Oriented Housing Development passed both houses,

concurrence

HB 1491 (Reed)


Creates density requirement in station areas

- 3.5 FAR w/in .5m of rail (.25m in cites <15,000 people)
- 2.5 FAR w/in .25m of BRT

Affordability for 50 yrs

- 10% of units if rents are 60% AMI & below
- 20% of units if rents are 80% AMI & below requires adoption of 20 yr MFTF program in

Requires adoption of 20 yr MFTE program in station areas



Housing Supply: Parking Requirements



Minimum Parking Requirements

HB 1299 (Peterson) dead / HB 5184

(Bateman) passed – delivered to Gov

Prohibits cities and counties from requiring:

- More than 0.5 parking space per multifamily residential unit and 1 per single family home
- More than 2 parking space per 1000 feet of commercial space

Does not apply to cities < than 30,000 people




Housing Bills

- SB 5559 Streamlining Subdivision Process passed both houses, concurrence
- HB 1494 MFTE Adjustments Delivered to Gov
- HB 1183 Modifying Building
 Code Delivered to Gov
 - HB 1403 Simplifying Condo Construction Delivered to Gov
