Subject: Regional Transportation Plan Development Process

IN BRIEF

At the June 20 meeting, the Regional TOD Committee will be briefed on the schedule, work program, and progress to-date developing the next long-range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The briefing will focus on TOD-related work to-date, including transit and active transportation, among other things.

DISCUSSION

Since the board adoption of the RTP scope of work in the fall of 2024, PSRC has been preparing data and analysis on the current transportation system and data collection and analysis in support of modeling scheduled for the summer of 2025. PSRC staff will highlight work in the following areas:

- Creation of a Current Transportation System Report (scheduled for release in June 2025) that highlights gaps and sets the stage for needs identification.
- Public engagement with the community, focusing on people with mobility and accessibility challenges and identification of mobility needs that highlights transitand infrastructure needs identified by these populations.
- In-progress development of a regional transit access assessment methodology.

PSRC staff will also provide an update on the RTP schedule and upcoming public engagement opportunities.

NEXT STEPS

At the September RTOD Committee meeting, PSRC will provide an update on progress developing the next RTP. By September, we anticipate ability to share initial draft regional transit access outputs.

Subject: Federal Updates, 2025 Legislative Session and TOD bill

IN BRIEF

PSRC staff and the Washington State Department of Commerce will review the outcome of the 2025 Legislative Session, including key bills related to housing and transit-oriented development.

DISCUSSION

The Washington State Legislature considered more than 2,300 bills during one of its busiest sessions ever, including numerous bills related to the Growth Management Act. Some notable bills related to planning that passed include:

- HB 1491 Transit-oriented development
- <u>SB 5184</u> Minimum parking requirements
- SB 5148 Housing Accountability Act

Commerce's Growth Management Services team tracks planning-related bills and will be working to implement the TOD bill. Commerce staff will provide an update on initial work to implement HB 1491.

PSRC regularly coordinates with Commerce and other state agencies to support work on legislative initiatives and their implementation. With the passage of the TOD bill, PSRC and Commerce will be working to determine where and how the bill applies.

PSRC staff will also provide an update on federal actions.

SUBJECT: Statewide TOD Study

IN BRIEF

The committee will hear about a statewide study of transit-oriented development and recommendations for transit-oriented development policies in Washington state.

DISCUSSION

In 2024, the Washington State Legislature funded a study to review transit-oriented development conditions in 33 specified cities in Washington. The study will also include recommendations for state-level policy to expand housing and mixed-use transit-oriented development that minimizes displacement of existing communities and ensures housing near transit remains affordable to low-income residents.

Urban Institute, working with Perkins Eastman, was selected to lead the study. Yonah Freemark with Urban Institute and Dave Catterson with the Joint Transportation Commission will provide an overview of the study, which is due to the legislature by June 30, 2025.
