
Population Trends

Total Population in Central Puget Sound, 2000-2025




Gray bars indicate U.S. recessions and the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Growth by Regional Geography, 2018-2025










The region has a large share of college graduates

Bachelor's Degree and Higher





Housing Unit Change by Type, 2000-2025








Median Home Sales Price in Central Puget Sound, 2012-2025






Monthly Rents are at all-time highs


Wage & Salary Jobs in July by Year, 2010-2025



% Change in Jobs by Sector, 2025 / 2024




Education & Health Services and Leisure and Hospitality are the only broad sectors that have added jobs in the past year.


Initial Weekly Unemployment Claims, State of WA, 2023-2025

Sales & Use Taxes by County, 2015-2024




Sales & Use tax collections increased 0.9% in 2024, the smallest increase outside of 2020 in the past decade.

Through July of 2025, more than 30.4 million passengers passed through SEA





Through July of 2025, more than 248k metric tons of air cargo passed through SEA





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






Transit Ridership continues to recover

Jan-June Total Boardings, 2002-2025




There were approximately 89 million boardings from January to July 2025 on the Region's transit system (79% of 2019 ridership)

Ratio of Jan-June Boardings: 2025 / 2019




Transit ridership in the Region is 79% of 2019 ridership - which ranks #12 out of the 27 largest Metro Areas in the nation

Traffic Deaths & Serious Injuries 2010-2024




335 people died on the region's roadways in 2024 and 1693 people were seriously injured.

Bike & Ped Deaths & Serious Injuries 2010-2024




522 people biking or walking were killed or seriously injured in 2024. Pedestrians accounted for 78% of this total.
