What is the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)?

PSRC will adopt a new RTP in 2026. The RTP is a long-range transportation plan which reflects the transportation needs and priorities of residents and workers in the central Puget Sound region. The goal of the plan is to improve mobility throughout the region and ensure that all people equitably benefit from the region's transportation system.

This fall, we have six regional public events to hear feedback on our plan in a fun and interactive environment. Each event will feature food, music and small group activities designed to help identify transportation priorities and needs.
