Discussion: WSDOT 2025-2027 Consolidated Grant Results

Jean Kim, PSRC, briefed the committee on the results of the WSDOT Consolidated Grant for the 2025-2027 biennium. In our region, encompassing King, Pierce, and Snohomish counties, a total of 27 projects were funded, including 10 projects awarded in 2022 for four years. CMAC will hold a Regional Priority Ranking debrief in November, and the next funding process is scheduled for the summer of 2026.

SUBJECT: Coordinated Mobility Plan — Strategies and Priorities

IN BRIEF

At the September meeting, CMAC will review draft Coordinated Mobility Plan strategies to discuss potential refinements and identify priorities (higher vs. lower) for addressing transportation needs highlighted during community engagement.

BACKGROUND

Strategies and activities to address transportation needs are required elements of the Coordinated Mobility Plan.¹ In previous meetings, CMAC reviewed transportation needs identified through outreach and began revising draft strategies. As part of the Plan update, PSRC is working with CMAC to shape a framework that:

- Defines desired outcomes for each identified transportation need.
- Refines or updates strategies to achieve those outcomes; and
- Establishes implementation roles and responsibilities to ensure regional progress through coordination.

In August, PSRC shared draft strategies and action steps for feedback. While staff are still reviewing and incorporating comments from agencies, including transit and human service providers. Attachment A provides the draft strategies for committee review and discussion. Please note that Attachment A lists the strategies by needs category shared in August and does not reflect any additional edits made since then. Staff will share suggested edits based on feedback received by the meeting date for the committee's discussion.

DISCUSSION

The September discussion will focus on:

- Reaching consensus on strategies and action steps to address the transportation needs of priority populations; and
- Identifying higher-priority strategies, based on resources, time, and feasibility of implementation.

Identifying priorities will help the region focus on the most urgent and achievable transportation needs. The relative importance of each strategy will vary by area depending on available resources, demand for services, and the extent of existing services.

CMAC members will be asked to consider:

- Strategies: Are there any strategies and/or activities (associated action steps) that need refinement before moving forward?
- Regional Priorities:
 - Which strategies are most urgent or impactful for priority populations (older adults, youth, people with disabilities, people with low incomes, people with limited English proficiency, and others)?
 - Which strategies are most feasible to implement in the near term?

NEXT STEPS

Input from the September meeting will inform final revisions to the Coordinated Mobility Plan's strategies. Once strategies and priorities are finalized, PSRC will work with CMAC to identify proposed action steps and performance measures to consistently monitor transportation programs and track progress toward desired outcomes for release in December 2025.
