SUBJECT: Regional Transportation Plan Development Process

IN BRIEF

At the September meeting, the Regional TOD Committee will be briefed on the schedule, work program, and recent progress to develop the next long-range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The briefing will focus on TOD-related work to-date, including transit, active transportation, and transit access.

DISCUSSION

Since the June RTOD Committee update on this project, PSRC have continued work to develop the next RTP as follows:

- In July, the Transportation Policy Board provided feedback on future scenarios to model.
- Staff have organized six regional public meetings to receive feedback on the
 future scenarios being modeled. These meetings are occurring in September and
 October. The sign-ups for regional public meetings are found on the RTP
 Engagement Hub. A flyer with meeting dates is also provided in the packet.
- Staff are working with a consultant to develop a regional transit access assessment that includes incorporation of future system data to show the differences between the current system and future with VISION 2050 growth and expanded transit.

PSRC staff will provide an update on these activities, the September Transportation Policy Board meeting, and the RTP schedule and upcoming public engagement opportunities.

NEXT STEPS

The agency is continuing to engage the Transportation Policy Board on RTP development that will result in a draft plan release in December 2025.

SUBJECT: HB 1491 TOD Bill Analysis

IN BRIEF

PSRC staff will share findings from a preliminary analysis of zoning changes related to HB 1491, the statewide TOD bill.

DISCUSSION

In 2025, the Washington state legislature passed <u>HB 1491</u> to promote transit-oriented development. The bill sets new statewide minimum zoning standards for increased density near qualifying light rail, commuter rail, and bus rapid transit stops, in addition to new housing affordability requirements. <u>Futurewise</u> has published an FAQ that summarizes key provisions of the bill.

PSRC staff have been working on a preliminary assessment of the scale of potential zoning impacts. Staff will share preliminary findings and technical considerations for completing this type of analysis. Staff welcome feedback on additional areas for analysis or guidance.

IN BRIEF

Urban Land Institute (ULI) will share their Technical Assistance Panel framework, process, and impacts of their regional TOD work with the committee.

DISCUSSION

The Urban Land Institute (ULI) is a global research and education nonprofit dedicated to shaping the future of the built environment for transformative impact. ULI Northwest advances that mission across the Pacific Northwest—serving public- and private-sector partners with pragmatic land use expertise and education. A core offering is ULI Northwest's **Technical Assistance Panel (TAP)** program, which assembles a multidisciplinary team of real estate and planning experts to provide actionable, strategic advice in response to specific land use and development assignments.

ULI has a long history of providing unbiased, pragmatic solutions and best practices for transit-oriented development. Since 2007, ULI has completed over 15 TOD focused TAPs in our region, from Everett to Tacoma. ULI will share TAP framework, process, and some impacts of their regional TOD work with the committee. Most recently, ULI convened five TAPs in partnership with Sound Transit on integrated development for select Seattle stations, which will be detailed in a future meeting.
