### **Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary**

#### **Welcome and Introductions**

Doug Cox, PSRC, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

#### **Action: Approval of Meeting Summary**

The June 11, 2025 meeting summary was approved as presented.

#### **Discussion: Regional Transportation Plan Status Update**

Doug Cox, PSRC, provided the committee with an update regarding the development of the 2026 Regional Transportation Plan. PSRC's Transportation Policy Board (TPB) gave PSRC direction regarding which investment scenarios PSRC should use for modeling and analysis. The scenarios will include new revenues, reduced investments, or a combination of both. PSRC will share these results with the TPB in September.

#### **Discussion: Mt. Rainier Scenic Railroad Freight Rail Service**

Bethan Maher, Executive Director, Western Forest Industries Museum (WFIM), informed the committee about plans to expand the existing tourist Mt. Rainier Scenic Railroad for short-line freight rail service. Western Forest Industries Museum is a non-profit organization that is dedicated to preserving and sharing stories of those in worked on and were impacted by the railroads while promoting sustainable and responsible economic development in the area.

The Scenic Railroad re-opened after the 2020 closure in 2023 with very successful tourist ridership. In 2024, WFIM began restoring 32 miles of track and upgrading bridges to freight service. WFIM purchased 32 miles of track from Tacoma Rail. WFIM formed Mt. Rainier Railroad LLC which has right-of-way ownership and common carrier obligation. The Mt. Rainier Railroad will operate all railroad services and launch freight operations for local lumber/ timber industry. WFIM plans to use a phased approach to

begin freight service, with the first phase focusing on transloading goods from the mills near Morton to Mineral.

### **Discussion: Other Business and Announcements**

Doug Cox, PSRC, shared that the USDOT is updating the National Freight Strategic Plan. This is a 5-year update to the first plan which was released in 2020. The update will include identifying corridors that emphasize four major sectors: agricultural, manufacturing, medical resources, and energy extraction. The plan will include performance metrics for corridors with the highest volume of these commodity types. The Plan will also summarize data provided by state freight plan, such as performance metrics, bottleneck locations, etc.

Xochitl Castaneda, Pacific Northwest and Alaska Gateway, shared that the USDOT has an opportunity for public comment regarding transportation safety that is open until September 10<sup>th</sup>.

Geri Poor, Port of Seattle, shared two announcements. First, the East Marginal Way Heavy Haul Pavement and Bike Lane project is being completed with a ribbon cutting at the end of August. Second, the Port of Seattle has an adult education program called Port University that provides tours of the port facilities
