

Regional Project Evaluation Committee Meeting Summary

Introductions and Announcements

Doug McCormick, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. He then took roll call to confirm the members and alternates present.

Approval of Meeting Summary

The May 23, 2025, RPEC meeting summary was approved as presented.

Transportation Policy Board Debrief

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, reviewed the Transportation Policy Board meeting held on June 12. The 'At Work' report for the Transportation Policy Board meetings are available on the PSRC website at: https://www.psrc.org/board/transportation-policy-board.

Discussion: Project Delivery

Kalon Thomas, PSRC, briefed the committee on current status of delivery of 2025 FHWA funds. The bulk of annual rebalancing activities were completed January through May. The primary things that have changed since May are some additional returns and deobligations, an additional exception request, and likely delivery in 2025 of a project that had received an extension. With these adjustments, the region is still on track to exceed its delivery target. About 92% of 2025 FHWA funds have either completed obligation or are in process, with paperwork not yet submitted for about 8%. Delivery status is ahead of where it was at this time in 2024, and staff feel that the process adjustments that pushed TIP updates related to rebalancing earlier in the year have helped foster earlier submittals. He reminded that WSDOT staff will be extremely busy until the end of the fiscal year, and in addition to delivery of PSRC funds, that everyone be responsive in delivering on their other FHWA funds as well. Kalon and Stephanie Tax, WSDOT, updated the committee on the status of the state's potential receipt of additional funds through redistributed obligation authority (OA). PSRC is confirming projects that have recently received high bids that could be candidates to receive funds if they are made available and will pass that information on to WSDOT, which makes final determinations in coordination with FHWA. Confirmation of whether funds will be available and which projects may receive them is expected in late August.

Discussion: Regional Transportation Plan

Kelly McGourty, PSRC, briefed the committee on status of the development of the Regional Transportation Plan. She reminded about the four building blocks that create the RTP financial strategy: under expenditures, the categories of maintenance, preservation and operations, and system improvements including regional capacity projects; under revenues, both current law revenue and new revenue sources. Since May, updated information was applied that increased the current law revenue estimate, and with those adjustments the estimated gap is about \$78.2 billion (21%). She provided a summary of the system improvements included in the plan, including Regional Capacity Projects that have been submitted, all other system improvements, and maintenance and preservation. She then discussed the levers available to bring the plan into balance, including potential new revenue sources and/or reducing investment levels. Board direction will be requested on identifying one or more scenarios to move into modeling and analysis that could include new revenues, reduced investments, or some combination of both. Analysis of the scenarios, across varied performance metrics, will be provided to the board in September. Then discussions will continue into the fall on policy direction, investments, financial strategy, and identifying action items to come out of the plan. The draft plan is planned to be complete and released for public comment in December.
