MULTIPLE BENEFITS

Water that runs off surfaces after a storm or even a light rain is the top contributor to pollution in streams, rivers, lakes, and Puget Sound. This pollution impacts salmon, orca, and other species.

As the region grows, we can create healthier communities by creating more parks and better managing stormwater runoff.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Local governments and community members can work together to identify locations needing improved stormwater management and recreational facilities. This project will provide guidance and technical assistance in locating and planning for stormwater parks.
